

## Sports Premium 2018-19

Highbury Infant School received £17,800 for their Sports Premium this academic year. This has been allocated in a variety of ways to increase sports opportunities in school and involve a greater number of children accessing additional opportunities.

The aims are to;

- engage all pupils in regular physical activity, leading to healthy active lifestyles
- increase the profile of PE and sport
- increase the confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- provide a broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- increase participation in competitive sport

To meet these aims, we have allocated our funding to provide;

• Keep Fit sessions for all, delivered by an external instructor	£1600
• Swimming for Years 1 and 2	£2200
• Yoga day for all the school, delivered by external instructor	£600
• Taster days, such as fencing	£600

• Membership of the North Herts Sports Partnership, including participation in the Infant Olympics	£1300
• Opportunities for increased physical outdoor activities, including lunchtimes with a playleader	£2200
• An additional multi-sports club, providing 45 places over the year	£1500
• Playtrition programme for Early Years delivered by Premier Sport	£2000
• Funtrition programme for Key Stage 1 delivered by Premier Sport	£2000
• Forest Schools activities	£3000
