Topic: Where the Wild Things Are!

Literacy

In Year 1 we will continue to follow the Success for All programme.

- The children will read high quality books, with specific reading skills being modelled and taught over the course of a week or two, before a written outcome is produced based on the text.
- Please see individual class teachers for more info on your child's specific units.

Science

- In Science we will deepen our understanding of seasonal changes, concentrating on how day length changes during different seasons.

PE

PE days will be on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. The PE kit currently consists of a white t-shirt with black shorts/jogging bottoms and trainers.

History, Geography, Art, Music, D&T and ICT

- In Art we will be creating self-portraits and designing our own 'Wild Thing' from collage materials. Then we will be taking a closer look at sculpture with the children getting hands on making their own Wild Thing out of clay.
- During our Computing sessions we will be creating 'Wild Things' using the paint tool and comparing how using technology to paint is different from using actual paint.
- In Geography we will be securing our understanding of simple maps and focusing on seasonal changes linking with our Science topic.

Numeracy

In Numeracy we will be following the Maths No Problem programme. We will start the half term exploring numbers to 40, thinking about tens and ones in numbers and finding one more and one less.

We will then move on to learning about addition and subtraction in word problems.

PSHCE and RE

- In RE we will be focusing on the Easter story, thinking about whether a surprise is always good.
- In PSHE we are thinking about how we are all different and all special.

Homework

- **Spellings:** Spellings will be sent home to practice every Friday ready for a test the following Friday.
- **Reading:** To be practiced every day. Children to read at home at least five times a week.
- **Phonics and Maths:** Phonics and maths homework will be set every Thursday and needs to be handed in the following Tuesday.
