School bags have to be stored in classrooms in the children's trays – which are quite flat. The vast majority of children do not require oversized backpacks as they only have their reading books inside. A school bookbag is the perfect size to fit in trays and ensure we can keep our cloakrooms and corridors safe and tidy. Can I please ask you to make sure your child has an appropriately sized bag in school? Thank you.
