We all want our children to grow up to be healthy adults, and in school we encourage the children to eat healthily. **The healthy eating** guidance has been sent home today. It is easier to eat well when those around you are doing the same, so please read the advice and send in food which is low in fat, salt and sugar.

**Please check your child's head on a weekly basis to prevent headlice.** Only treat if you find live lice, a pharmacy will advise you on the best lotion to use. Check one week, and then two weeks after treating, as eggs (nits) attached to the hair shaft may have



hatched. Retreatment is only necessary if you see live lice, empty egg cases can cling to the hair even after all the lice have been eliminated, but over use of lotions can breed resistant lice. A nit comb is a great investment! Headlice are not a sign of dirty hair, but they are very uncomfortable to have, please help us minimise their numbers in school by checking for them on a regular basis, and certainly if you are aware of your child scratching.
