## WORLD MATHS DAY!



World Maths Day is usually celebrated on Wednesday 6th March 2019. However due to World Book Day and Pancake day happening in the same week, classes will be marking this day by doing activities on the morning of **FRIDAY 15<sup>TH</sup> MARCH**. Parents will be invited into classes between **9.00am -9.30am** on the morning that your child's class will be celebrating.

Please see below for details of the day that your child's class will be celebrating and what your child's class will be up to!

CLASS	ACTIVITY
<b>F2 FRIDAY 15<sup>TH</sup> MARCH</b>	F2 will be exploring patterns with colour, shape and size and natural patterns outdoors. We will then be creating our own pictures based on patterns.
<b>Y1 FRIDAY 15<sup>TH</sup> MARCH</b>	Y1 will be exploring all different kinds of shapes. We will then be completing an exciting DT shape building challenge!
<b>Y2 FRIDAY 15<sup>TH</sup> MARCH</b>	Class Two will be carrying out their very own times tables investigations on World Maths Day with a carousel of activities on each table which will help children with their practice of the 2, 3, 5 and 10 times tables!
<b>Y3 FRIDAY 15<sup>TH</sup> MARCH</b>	Y3 will be having a morning consisting of problem solving and reasoning. We will start off with a maths meeting and then they will be working in groups to solve different problems. They will then be explaining to their friends how they solved them. We will also be holding a times tables competition where certificates will be given out.
<b>Y4 FRIDAY 15<sup>TH</sup> MARCH</b>	Year 4 will be looking at making numbers. Throughout the morning we will be playing Countdown, exploring Mayan maths and creating our own method for recording numbers.
<b>Y5 FRIDAY 15<sup>TH</sup> MARCH</b>	Year 5 will be exploring mathematical art and we will create our own logical artwork! As it's our PE day for the Snowflake Appeal, we'll also take part in active maths activities throughout the day. Our sponsored mile in the afternoon will be accompanied with some times tables songs to keep us going!
<b>Y6 FRIDAY 15<sup>TH</sup> MARCH</b>	Y6 will be using the Cuisenaire rods to develop and further our reasoning skills linked to ratio and algebra.

The NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe. programme is visiting our school to make sure our pupils have the knowledge and understanding they need to stay safe from abuse.

I'm pleased to tell you that we will be working with the NSPCC, the UK's leading children's charity, who'll be delivering their Speak out. Stay safe. programme on **14th March 2019**. This is a nationwide programme for every primary-school-aged child in the UK and Channel Islands. With the help of their friendly mascot Buddy, they'll be presenting an assembly to the children in our school as well as a workshop for Years 5 and 6.

What is the Speak out. Stay safe. programme?

Through child-friendly, interactive assemblies and workshops their specially trained staff and volunteers will give our children information about how to keep themselves safe from harm and how to get help if they have any worries, sensitively discussing issues like bullying and sexual abuse, without using scary words or adult language.

We have studied the content of the materials and heard from other schools who have participated and are extremely confident that they are appropriate for primary-school-aged children. By the end of their visit, we're convinced children will feel empowered – knowing how they can speak out and stay safe.

## Y5 BIKEABILITY WEEK!

**MONDAY 15<sup>TH</sup> APRIL – THURSDAY 18<sup>TH</sup>  
APRIL**

Our School has been chosen as one of a few schools in Sheffield to receive Bikeability Cycle Training. This course seeks to give children the skills and confidence to cycle safely on the road. This fun course starts in the playground and will continue on quiet roads around the school.

**In order for your child to take part, you will need to complete the consent form sent home from Miss McKay and return it to school by Friday 15th March. The training is FREE.**

Ideally your child will use their own bike for the training, but bikes can be loaned to those without. Information about requesting the loan of these items is included in the letter sent home.

This course is suitable for children who can already ride a bike, and are pretty stable, i.e. be able to look behind whilst riding, without wobbling, and hold a signal for about 3 seconds. If your child cannot yet ride, you can advise Bikeability in the permission slip and they may be able to teach them during their time in school.

The cycling will continue whatever the weather, so please send your child with warm and waterproof clothing. Gloves are a good idea. We suggest that pupils wear trousers or tracksuit bottoms when training and, if the weather is warm, get them to bring sunscreen and a water bottle.

## Y5 LEEDS HEADINGLEY CRICKET GROUND TRIP

WEDNESDAY 27<sup>th</sup> MARCH

Y5 have been invited to take part in a practical cricket session at Headingley Cricket Ground in Leeds and a classroom based Numeracy, Literacy and Geography enrichment activity. After lunch we will receive a tour of the YCCC Museum and even have access to behind the scenes areas of the ground – including the Player’s Area!

We will leave school at 08:45 to arrive in Leeds for 10:00. We will be returning to school at about 3.30-3.45pm depending on traffic.

Children should wear warm comfortable clothing suitable for participating in physical activity e.g. tracksuit bottoms and trainers or equivalent, but children do need to wear their school jumper or school polo shirt. Children will need to bring a packed lunch. If your child receives free school meals and you would like to order a packed lunch for the day, please contact the school office.
