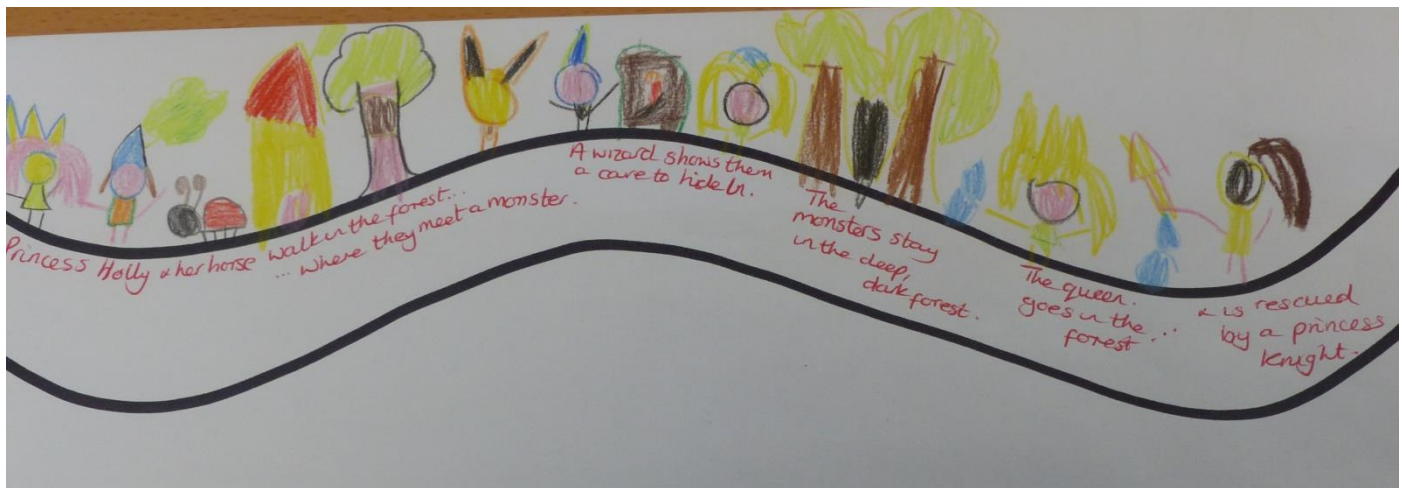




Author Hour

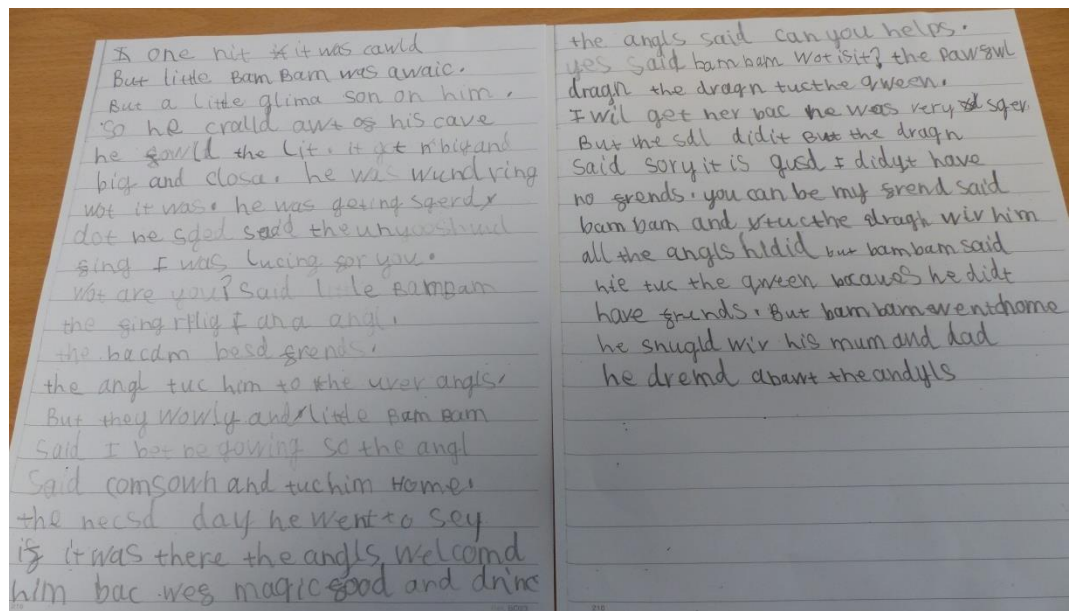

A superb report about the first landing on the moon.



During this time I will have free choice to write about anything that I would like. My writing will be presented as I choose and will be illustrated in the way I would like it to appear if it were published.

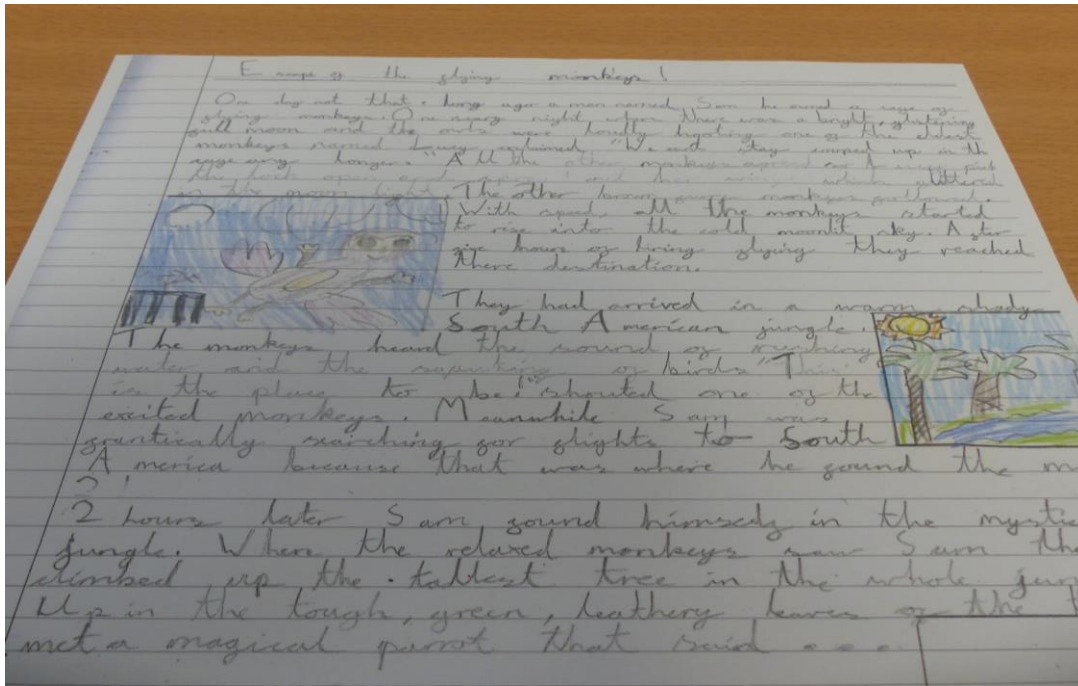


Blast off!

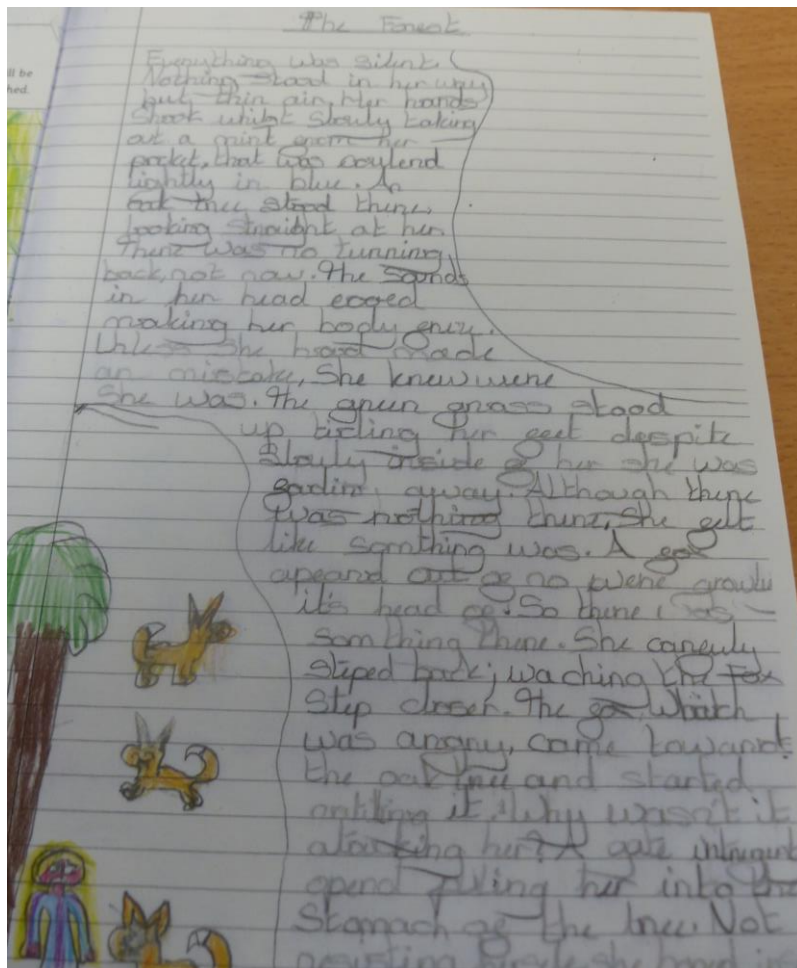

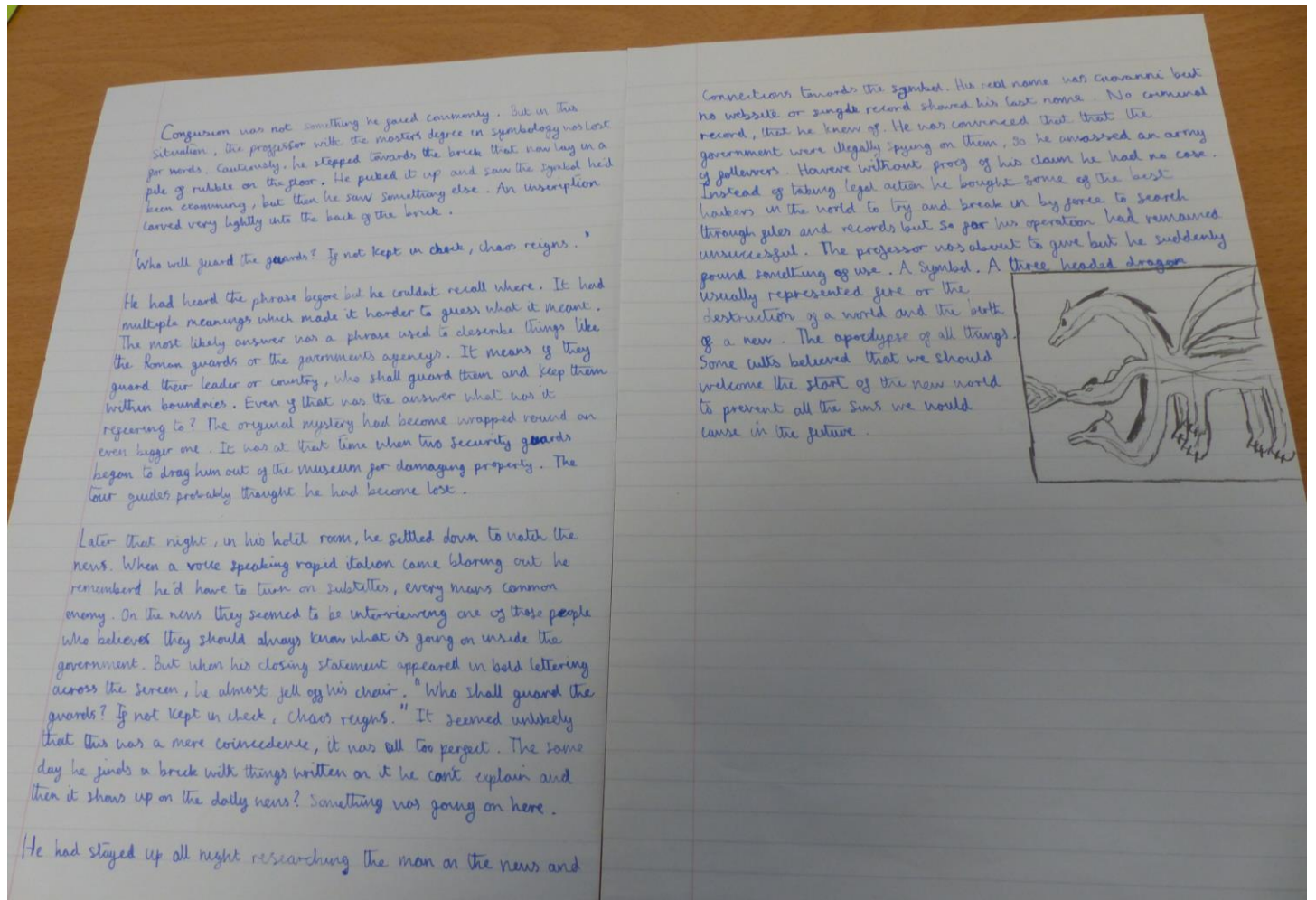
Great illustrations for this story all about a flying monkey.
