What We Will Do/Have Done

- To improve the variety of school dinners by holding a number of Theme days throughout the year with different foods available on that day.
- More Sports- we have entered a Netball League and have contacted the Wigan Warriors to find out if/when the Contact Rugby re-starts; we have also entered the Graeme Jarvis Football Cup and games will commence after half-term. This term we have offered after-school clubs for: gymnastics, yoga, golf and Taekwondo
- We have reminded teachers to send information via the Office in good time.
- This term we have visited the local area in KS1 as part of the Geography topic. We have also had small groups take part in the interschool challenges in spelling and Maths and taken part in Citizenship Workshops at New Central Park. Year 3 have worked with students from Edge Hill on dance and the whole school have experienced drama productions from the students at Runshaw College. Year 1 and Reception have worked on Chinese New Year with the Confucius Academy from Wigan and Leigh College. We are continually looking to broaden the learning experiences for children as we develop our creative curriculum.
