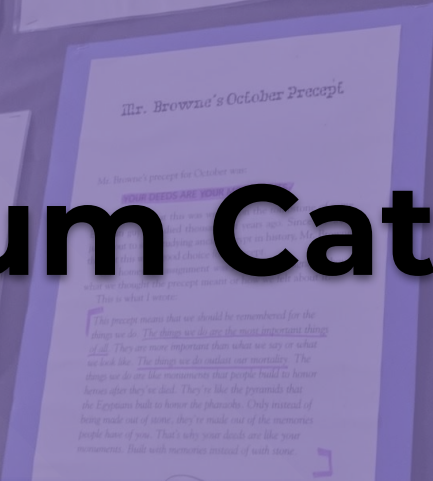

What are KS2 SATs?

KS2 SATs are tests children take at the end of Year 6. Key Stage 2 SATs test children on what they have learnt between Year 3 and Year 6.

KS2 SATs are **mandatory** tests from the National Curriculum assessment programme. All state schools in England are required to provide the tests.

SATs are used to reflect the level at which your child is working.

Assessment and Reporting

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text

- 'Old' national curriculum levels (e.g. Level 3, 4, 5) have now been abolished, as set out in the government guidelines.
- From 2016, test scores are now reported as 'scaled scores'.
- **The new curriculum is more rigorous and sets high expectations which all schools have had to work hard to meet since the beginning of last year.**

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Scaled Scores

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- What is meant by 'scaled scores'?
- '100' will represent the 'national standard'.
- Each pupil's raw test score will therefore be converted into a score on the scale, either at, above or below 100.
- The scale will have a lower end point somewhere below 100 and an upper end point above 100.
- A child who achieves the 'national standard' (a score of 100) will be judged to have demonstrated sufficient knowledge in the areas assessed by the tests.
- In July 2019 each pupil will receive:
 - A raw score (number of raw marks awarded).
 - A scaled score in each tested subject.
 - Confirmation of whether or not they attained the national standard.

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Scaled Score Examples

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On publication of the test results in July 2019:

- A child awarded a scaled score of 100 is judged to have met the **'national standard'** in the area judged by the test.
- A child awarded a scaled score of more than 100 is judged to have exceeded the national standard. A score of 110 or above is an indication that a child is **'working at greater depth.'**
- A child awarded a scaled score of less than 100 is judged to have not yet met the national standard and performed below expectation for their age. This is also referred to as **'working towards the national standard.'**

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The Tests

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- Key Stage 2 SATs take place nationally in the week commencing 13th May 2019.
- Statutory tests will be administered in the following subjects:
 - MONDAY
 - Punctuation, Vocabulary and Grammar (45 minutes)
 - Spelling (approximately 20 minutes)
 - TUESDAY
 - Reading (60 minutes)
 - WEDNESDAY
 - Mathematics
 - Paper 1: Arithmetic (30 minutes)
 - Paper 2: Reasoning (40 minutes)
 - THURSDAY
 - Paper 3: Reasoning (40 minutes)
- All tests are externally marked.
- Writing will be 'Teacher Assessed' internally, as in recent years.

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How to Help Your Child

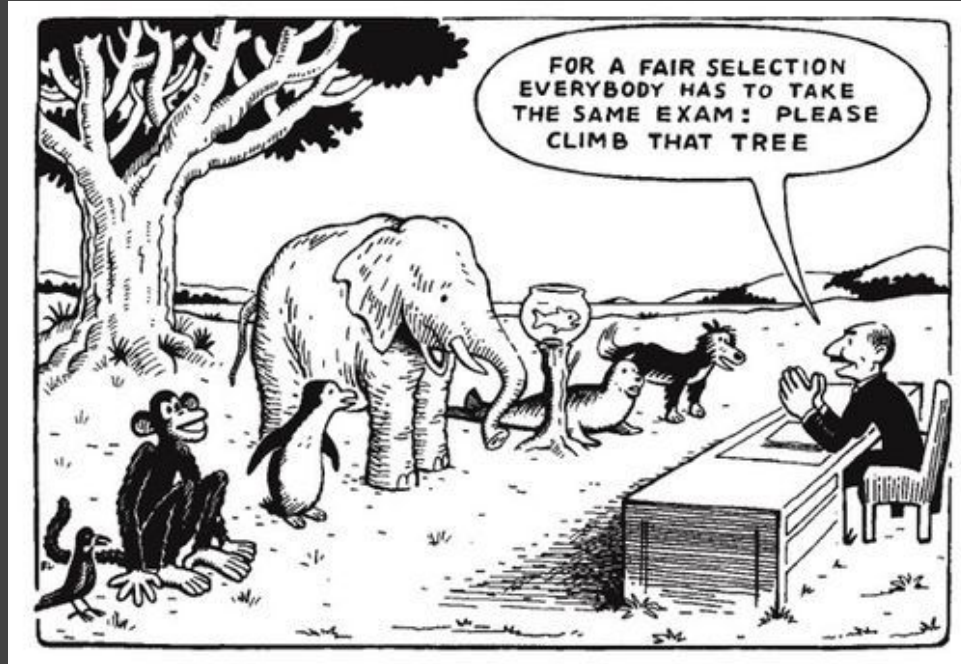
