Metal Man Mancing

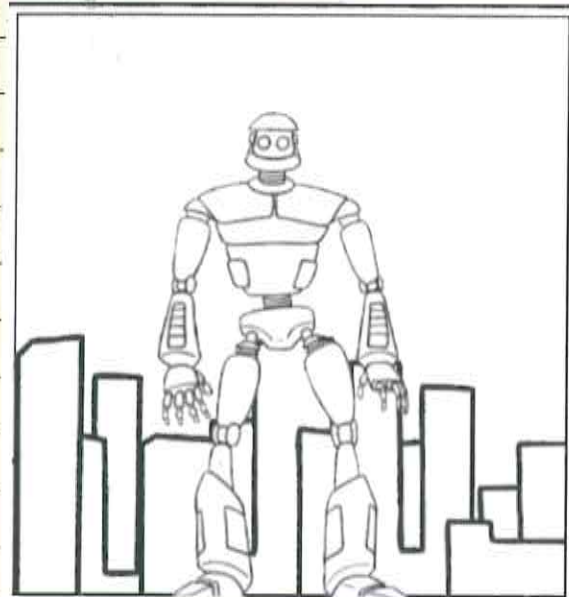
There were scenes of terror this morning as a ~~the~~ colossal Iron Giant was crunching on houses, farmers machinery and alot of metal.
