SEND Support - Level Three

A pupil is assessed as 'Level 3 SEND Support' when their needs are complex, severe and persistent and impact most areas of the curriculum, social inclusion, social situations and unstructured times. Pupils accessing at Level 3 on the SEND list will have a personalised curriculum and increased time spent in 1:1 teaching situations. Specialist services will provide advice, training and support on individualised targets. Strategies will be in place to ensure regular communication between parents/ carers and school and an annual review of the EHCP will take place.
