Prime Areas

PSED—we have related the children's learning to Jack stealing things from the giant and whether he should have taken the objects or not.

Physical— During PE the children have really enjoyed using the apparatus and practising their positional language, travelling over and under objects.

Communication and Language The children have been discussing what they would like to find at the top of the beanstalk and their ideas have been extremely imaginative!

Specific Areas

Literacy— This week the children have been reading 'Jack and the Beanstalk'.

Phonics The children have been learning the following new sounds: air, ure, ear, er. We also recapped all of the other sounds that have been taught and put them into words and sentences.

Maths— The children have been learning about height and how they could measure objects using non-standard units. They have been using the following vocabulary— tall, taller, tallest, short, shorter, shortest.

Understanding the World— The children have planted their own beans and we will be observing how they grow and measure
