



Dear Parents and Carers,

Please see below this week's notices:

- Firstly, thank you for all the effort parents/carers and children went to in order for Red Nose Day go so well. It has been lovely to see so many children dressed in red and to hear the excitement when they went to choose their selection of cakes. Today we raised over £880 for this very worthy cause – thank you for your generosity.
- If you bring your child to school by car and drop off in the surrounding area, in Belfast Street and Malvern Street in particular, please will you **not** leave your car engine running. Many of the children walking to and from school are at exhaust height and vulnerable to toxic fumes.
