

What should I already know?

- The **village** I live in is called Great Cornard, which is in Suffolk. There are **villages** and **towns** in Suffolk, some of which are **coastal**.
- Suffolk is in England, which is a **country**. England, which is in the United Kingdom, is in the **continent** of Europe.
- The seven **continents** (including Europe) and five oceans.
- The Anglo-Saxons **migrated** from Germany and began to settle in Britain around AD 450.

migration	movement from one place to another in order to settle there
mountain	a very high area of land with steep sides
physical features	natural features of land
port	a harbour area where ships loads and unload goods or passengers

tourist	a person who is visiting a place for pleasure and interest, especially when they are on holiday.
trade	the activity of buying, selling or exchanging goods and services.
weather	any of the main points of a compass: north, south, east, west, north-east, north-west, south-east, south-west
vegetation	plants, trees or flowers
village	a small group of houses, perhaps with a few shops. Great Cornard is a village .

What will I know by the end of the unit?

- Germany has a landscape of **forests**, **rivers**, **mountain** ranges and North Sea beaches - this means that some of Northern Germany is **coastal**.
- Germany is in Western and Central Europe, with Denmark bordering to the north, Poland and the Czech Republic to the east, Austria to the south-east, Switzerland to the south-west, France, Luxembourg and Belgium to the west and Holland, or the Netherlands, to the northwest.
- The **climate** in Germany is similar to that of the UK - the summers are warm and winters are cool.
- Both the UK and Germany have **rivers** that join the North Sea.

- Use aerial photographs to compare Suffolk in the UK and Germany in Europe. What is the same? What is different?
- Describe the locations of Suffolk in the UK and Germany in Europe using the eight **compass points**.

- Create a Venn diagram to compare similarities and differences between Germany and Suffolk.
