

Policy 3

BEHAVIOUR PRINCIPLES WRITTEN STATEMENT

Ratified by Governors February 2019

Rationale

- High standards of behaviour create a climate for learning and enable pupils to feel safe and happy.

Statement of Intent

- To promote and reward good behaviour
- To set and maintain clear expectations regarding attitudes towards other pupils, staff and learning
- To clearly communicate expectations and consequences to parents
- To ensure unacceptable behaviour is dealt with consistently, swiftly and fairly, taking into account pupil age and any additional needs or disabilities
- To prevent bullying
- To have clear procedures in place with regards to the use of positive handling/reasonable force and quiet spaces
- To involve outside agencies as required and where possible

Strategies

- Ensure staff produce clear guidelines and expectations of pupil behaviour with consequences (including detentions, isolation and loss of privileges) and rewards as appropriate
- Communicate behaviour management plans, consequences and rewards with parents which will include the use of positive handling/reasonable force and quiet spaces where appropriate
- Train staff in managing difficult behaviour, including physical aggression
- To train staff regarding the management of bullying
- Train staff regarding the restraint of pupils
- Train staff regarding searching of pupils

Frequency: FGB discretion of Annually or 2 years

Review date: Spring 2020
