





# FURTHER SUPPORT FOR GRADUATES IN THE ISLE OF MAN



**Professional Qualifications** - There are several professional and education providers in the Isle of Man which offer high quality professional training courses. MPES offer accountancy and professional training in ACA, ACCA, CPD and more. The Marketing Partnership is the Island's only accredited study centre for CIM programmes. University College Isle of Man (UCM) also offer a range of business-related and vocational courses for graduates looking to obtain professional accreditations and enhance their CV.

National Insurance Holiday for Graduates - The scheme provides individuals locating to the Isle of Man for work, with a refund of up to £4,400 in National Insurance contributions after their first 12 months of employment for those earning minimum gross salary of £23,000. Manx students returning to the Isle of Man, and graduates relocating to the Island are eligible to apply - another compelling reason to consider starting your career in the Isle of Man.

### **HEALTHCARE**

Manx Care is the Isle of Man's equivalent of the UK's National Health Service (NHS). It employs around 3,000 colleagues, with an aspiration to be 'the best small Island health and care system in the world'.

In parallel, a cultural development programme will transform the colleague experience, allowing them to play a leading role within the transformation of services, supporting their development, and creating an environment where they can flourish in their careers.

Manx Care offers exceptional career prospects for Doctors, Nurses, Social Workers and Allied Health Professionals, with fully funded further education opportunities across a number of specialist areas. ## MEET MADDY

Maddy Taggart returned to the Isle of Man in 2020 to become a midwife, after studying midwifery at the University of Surrey.

'I decided to return to the Isle of Man to complete my first-year preceptorship at the Jane Crookall Maternity Ward as I had worked there as a midwifery care assistant before my studies and knew I would be well supported. The role came with a great relocation package. This included covering my relocation expenses, financial assistance towards my rent and a refund on my first-year national insurance contributions.

Since joining Manx Care, I've been presented with many training and development opportunities, including an intensive week induction with a group of other recruits. I was also matched with a qualified midwife that I shadowed and who acted as a mentor in my first month or so – this meant I wasn't thrown in the deep end, and it really allowed me to build up my confidence.

Due to the size of the team and the maternity ward here, you are required to take on a lot of responsibilities across many areas. This means the role is really varied, and I've

learnt an awful lot in a short space of time. So much so, that I completed my preceptorship competencies within seven months and moved from a Band 5 to a Band 6 grade much quicker than my UK counterparts, where it typically takes a year.

The midwifery department encourage development and further education, with several of my colleagues studying towards Masters, or looking to specialise in certain areas. If you show an interest in an area and voice it to management, they will listen as it's such a flexible working environment.

The pay here is significantly more than in the UK as well, as is the career progression, but the most rewarding element of the job is the continuity of care that we offer our patients - which is second to none. In the Isle of Man, you meet the mother at her induction, and stay with her throughout the entire process, even up to post-natal care. This means we have to cross-skill across multiple areas, whether that's triage or post-natal, which means we are agile and constantly developing – it also makes the job incredibly satisfying!'

Professional development is strongly encouraged in the sector, with many opportunities for further study and career progression for recent graduates, all the way through to headship.



# MEET CATHARINE

Catharine Potter moved to the Isle of Man from London with her partner in late 2020. Catharine is completing her first year of teaching training at QEII secondary school in Peel, after completing a Masters in History at the University of Roehampton.

'I have always known I wanted to go into a career in teaching, and having studied History at university, knew this was the subject I was passionate about and wanted to specialise in once qualified. In late 2020, my partner (who is Manx) and I, decided to leave London to move to the Isle of Man. We had become disenchanted with city life, and having been through several major lockdowns, wanted a more relaxed and rural lifestyle.

At this point I was studying remotely, so we took this opportunity to relocate to the Island. There were a range of secondary schools to choose from, but I had my heart set on QEII in Peel as that was where my partner went to school and grew up. I was fortunate enough to be able to secure a two-year teaching training position at the school almost immediately. The school have been incredibly welcoming and have provided me with many opportunities in a short space of time, including being given the chance to train as a Duke of Edinburgh supervisor. I asked the Head if I could start an extra-curricular history club for students — a suggestion that was welcomed with open arms. I now run this at lunchtimes twice a week.



The school are very keen to invest in you; I have regular one to ones with management and I am encouraged to complete regular online training courses centred around personal development. I'm frequently supervised in class-based scenarios, which provides invaluable feedback and allows me to constantly develop as I am training.

I've found my time at QEII incredibly rewarding. Being surrounded by spectacular nature and living only a 10-minute walk away from the sea has done wonders for my wellbeing and sense of work-life balance. I've been pleasantly surprised at how much there is to do on the Island – whether that's going to a local event, stopping by one of the Manx National Heritage sites, or going for a few drinks with friends in my favourite place Castletown. Having not really known anyone before I moved, I have been incredibly welcomed by this close-knit community.'

### FINANCE AND PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

The financial and professional services sector in the Isle of Man contributes over 40% of the Island's GDP and is incredibly diversified, comprising of a variety of sub-sectors, including:

With the industry undergoing a period of growth, there are many opportunities for those looking to start their financial career. It is a mature sector with many opportunities with on average over 70 graduate positions available across these areas, with many offering fast-track schemes and training routes for graduates.

The industry is renowned for quick career progression, along with competitive salaries and benefits in comparison to the UK.

#### **ACCOUNTING**

Due to the Island's well-established finance sector, the accountancy work available on the Isle of Man is diverse, complex, and engaging – equal to, or often surpassing, the quality of work in major global cities. The diverse nature of the Manx economy means that there is a wide range of client work, and a variety of organisations, including all four 'Big 4' firms, along with an array of international businesses and well-established accountancy practices.

Many of these organisations will fully fund the professional training fees required to qualify for ICAEW (ACA) and ACCA, along with a broad range of CPD opportunities. Jobs in demand fall across a variety of specialisms including accountancy, audit, advisory, tax and more. Once qualified, the average salary in the sector is £39,500 per annum.

#### **PROFESSIONAL SERVICES**

The professional services sector accounts for a large portion of the overall finance industry, with a host of graduate placements and mentoring programmes within the legal profession, Corporate Service Providers (CSPs), investment management, and life assurance sectors; with most employers offering generous remuneration packages. Many also fund employees' professional examinations including the likes of the Manx Bar Exams and STEP qualifications.

#### **COMPLIANCE**

The compliance profession heavily supports both the Island's finance and tech sectors, with a huge breadth of roles available across these diverse industries. With many organisations offering training and development opportunities for graduates from the outset.

To support finance and professional services in the Isle of Man there are a number of associations and societies, with many organising regular social events; perfect for making new friends and networking with likeminded individuals.

George Willoughby studied History at Leeds Beckett University. After graduating he completed a Graduate Diploma in Law. He returned to the Isle of Man in 2020 and now works in compliance at Ramsey Crookall & Co. Ltd, an independent firm of stockbrokers and investment managers.

'I grew up in the Isle of Man and due to the pandemic, decided to return home to complete the latter half of my post-graduate degree.

Following my Graduate Diploma in Law, I decided to apply to the Department for Enterprise's Internship Programme, which provides graduates with the opportunity to complete a paid-for internship placement on Island. I was paired with a local law firm where I remained for a month, performing legal research and administrative tasks.

Following that, I completed an internship with a coworking space in Castletown where I was tasked with a number of compliance-related duties. As a result of this experience, I secured an internship at Ramsey Crookall & Co. Ltd where I was placed in the compliance department, reviewing the company's GDPR policy. After my internship ended, I saw compliance as a very viable option, and a great way of putting my Law degree to good use, within a less traditional setting. I expressed my interest to Ramsey Crookall, who formally offered me a permanent position once my internship concluded.

Since joining the firm, I've been given plenty of opportunities. We are heavily encouraged to gain further professional qualifications and I have completed my Introduction to Securities and Investments qualification from the Chartered Institute for Securities and Investment and have applied to complete further qualifications through the International Compliance Association. These have been fully funded by Ramsey Crookall.

I work in a small team that has oversight across many facets of the business, this means every day is different and my job is incredibly varied, providing me with a great deal of experience that I would not get in another role or even in a larger company. One week I might be writing a report on client assets for the Financial Service Authority and then the next,

speaking to fund administrators about Anti-Money Laundering procedures. It's fast paced and can change in an instant!

It has been wonderful to return home and see friends and family whenever I like. What I have most relished, is being able to return to several of my former sporting leagues and play alongside many of the people I grew up with.'

'Although I didn't know it at the time, studying in the Isle of Man was the greatest decision I've made to date.

In 2019 I embarked on a degree in Events Management and Marketing at the University College Isle of Man, and at the same time commenced my second year working as Head Bartender at Extra Fancy (a local hospitality company with a passion for exceeding expectations) at their late-night bar, Peggy's.

Studying on the Isle of Man allowed me to retain my position within the company - who have always been supportive and accommodating of my studies, and unlike many of my contemporaries in the UK, both network and build a career in hospitality. Coupling the knowledge gained from my degree, with real work experience, enabled me to quickly progress at Extra Fancy, and once graduated I became Director - an opportunity that probably wouldn't have presented itself had I not stayed on Island.

A career in hospitality can lead down the most satisfying of paths. In the relatively short time I've been in the industry, I've experienced; a group of colleagues who feel more like family; leadership which allows talent and hard work to thrive and a job which feels more like a passion.

The year 2022 has given me my biggest achievements to date; being crowned the winner of global hospitality competition '50 Best Bars: The Blend Scholarship' and
