Fiji	Entry rules in response to coronavirus (COVID-19): The Fiji government has announced changes to International travel due to COVID-19. The Fiji border remains closed to British tourists. Only residents and Fijian citizens are allowed to return to Fiji. Ahead of travel, returning residents and non-Fiji citizens must request approval from the Office of the Prime Minister for entry (by air or sea) into Fiji. Contact the Office of the Prime Minister by email: borderrequest@immi.gov.fj . Further information can be found on the Fiji government website. All foreign nationals who are currently stranded in Fiji have been advised to contact Fiji Immigration Office so that they could be properly guided to maintain their legal status. This applies to all categories of permit holders. Hawaii	Governor Ige issued the twentieth supplemental proclamation, which authorizes the quarantine exception for inter-county travelers vaccinated in Hawaii starting May 11. Governor Ige issued the nineteenth supplemental proclamation, which includes mention of an anticipated new exception for vaccinated trans-Pacific travelers that will become effective only upon approval by the director of the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency. This exception is not available as of today. All trans-Pacific travelers are required to have a negative test result from a trusted travel partner before their departure for Hawaii, in order to bypass the mandatory 10-day quarantine. Test results will not be accepted once a traveler arrives in Hawaii. Japan	From January 14, 2021 until further notice, all Japanese nationals and foreign nationals with the status of residence are also required to pledge to refrain from using public transportation for 14 days, and to be in quarantine at home or other designated areas for 14 days, retain the location data, and provide it to the health centers or other institutions, if requested. (If separate quarantine measures are to be taken, those also need to be pledged.) They are required to sign and submit the Written Pledge(PDF) Open a New Window when entering Japan. In case of violation, they may be subject to detention under Quarantine Act and the following shall apply: (i) For Japanese nationals, names and other information that contribute to preventing the spread of infection may be made public. (ii) For foreign nationals with the status of residence, names, nationalities, and other information that contribute to preventing the spread of infection may be made public. They may also be subject to the revocation of status of residence and procedures for deportation under Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Law. Those who do not submit the "Written Pledge" are requested to stay at a location designated by the Chief of the Quarantine Station (only at the accommodation booked by the quarantine office) for 14 days. Malaysia	The entire nation will be put under COVID-19 travel restriction beginning 12 May 2021 until 7 June 2021 following the latest directives by our Malaysian government to stem the rising number of cases in the country. Therefore, encouraging the public to continue to stay at home with strict enforcement of the Movement Control Order (MCO) will curb the infection. During the MCO, economic activities would be allowed to continue throughout the country, but interstate and inter-district travel, as well as social activities, events and dining-in at restaurants, are not permitted. However, travel across state and district are only granted for emergencies, work, health, vaccination appointments and visiting long-distance spouses. Meanwhile, the Reciprocal Green Lane (RGL) for businesses travellers between Malaysia and Singapore will be suspended beginning 13 May 2021 after Singapore reported COVID-19 transmissions involving SARS-CoV-2 Variant of Concern (VOC). Hence, travellers from Singapore who wish to enter Malaysia for business purposes would have to go through the One-Stop Centre (OSC) managed by the Malaysian Investment Development Agency (MIDA). In addition, all travellers arriving in Malaysia from Singapore under Periodic Communicating Arrangement (PCA) must undergo a mandatory 14-day quarantine at quarantine centres starting 13 May 2021, up from the current 10-day period. Malaysia	Malaysia will temporarily bar flights and transits from and to India to curb the spread of the new Indian COVID-19 variant in the country beginning 28 April 2021. The ban will also apply on ships with travel history to India over the past 14 days, except for Malaysian travellers and crew members subjected to mandatory 14-day quarantine before entry. Indian citizens with a valid Malaysian work permit will also be denied entry to Malaysia as well as international students and business travellers from India. But foreigners who are spouses to Malaysians are allowed to return. Recently, our government has introduced the new Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) for foreign returnees from countries with reported SARS-CoV-2 Variant of Concern (VOC) to stem the spread of these new COVID-19 variants in Malaysia. The returnees need to take a swab test three days before departure to Malaysia and undergo quarantine at designated centres, with the 10-day quarantine period being extended to 14 days. Besides, the returnees, among others, need to use the MySejahtera app to register the QR code upon arrivals in Malaysia and undergo another swab test on the 10th day of the quarantine. In fact, the Sabah state government has also decided to ban India, France, America, Africa and Brazil nationals from entering the state in view of these COVID-19 variants effective 28 April 2021.
