1. Action Points Review

The action points from the Coordination Meeting on 6 July were reviewed:

- Key local supply chain and market alerts were shared for the last week. If partners would like a copy of the report, please contact chifundo.ntupanyama@wfp.org. - **ongoing**

- Logistics Cluster to continue to share updates on access issues following the recent flooding across Somalia (road and airstrip accessibility), specifically on Jowhar. – **ongoing**
- The Logistics Cluster will share a new Flood Affected Roads map with more comprehensive coverage of roads. – **completed**
- A new Airport Access map is being developed and will be shared by the Logistics Cluster. The map shows the access status of airports and their access roads. – **completed**
- OCHA to follow up on the permit requirement for air operations to Ghabahare and share any updates with the Logistics Cluster. – **completed**
- Partners to email chifundo.ntupanyama@wfp.org if they experience access issues with humanitarian flights in Afmadow and Dhobley. -**Completed**
- The Logistics Cluster to share the Time Charter Vessel Schedule. -**Completed**

2. Situation Update

- The updated [Roads Access](#) map and [Airport Access map](#) (as of 8 July) are available.
- A new Airport Access map has been developed and shared by the Logistics Cluster. The map shows the access status of airports.
- The Logistics Cluster also expanded the coverage of the Road access map to include all the primary roads. Partners are invited to email chifundo.ntupanyama@wfp.org if there are any key routes aside from these that they would like included in the Logistics Cluster Maps.
- Access challenges that are affecting cross-border operations, inland transport, and airlift operations were discussed:
 - The Jowhar corridor remains an area of concern due to flooding.
 - Some roads in the South of Somalia (ex-Mogadishu) are closed due to access constraints.
 - Jalalaqsi and Afmadow Airports are now accessible.
 - Garbaharey no longer has additional requirements for air operations.
 - El Wak airstrip is currently not accessible due to physical conditions of the airstrip. Alternative solutions are being sought given the urgent airlift priorities re-iterated by key partners.
- All ports remain operational however strong winds at Berbera Port are delaying operations and causing congestion.
- WFP time-chartered vessel MV Spiekeroog – currently in Mogadishu. Next port of call is Mombasa ETA 05.08.2021
- The Logistics Cluster shared the key local supply chain and market alerts for the last week:
 - Prices increased in South and Central Somalia due to high demand during the Eid celebrations.
 - There were price increases in Banadir/Hirshabelle as a ripple effect of prices increases in source markets coupled with restricted sea movement causing prolonged lead times.
 - Somaliland also experienced an increase in prices due to a rise in transport costs.
 - Supply flow and prices of key commodities remained stable across Puntland markets.
 - Cross-border trade between Ethiopia and Somalia, continues uninterrupted leading to steady supplies of key commodities into markets.

- OCHA shared that market prices in Wajid have increased due to market access constraints for suppliers.

3. Cargo Transport Requirements

- The Logistics Cluster has passed the 1,000 mt delivery mark since it was activated, delivering a cumulative 1,068 mt of cargo.
- The Logistics Cluster has facilitated the delivery 687.6 mt of cargo so far in 2021: Air (664.6 mt); Land (15 mt); and Sea (8.1 mt) for nine organizations.
- Deliveries for the interagency humanitarian intervention in Huddur have slowed down but if there are future needs the Logistics Cluster is ready to support.
- The Logistics Cluster is currently receiving new requests. Movements have already been requested for Baidoa and Dollow. Organizations were encouraged to share their requests for these locations and others for consolidated planning.
- Taking into account requirements from partners, the Logistics Cluster is working on funding scenarios going forward given the outlook on resources until the end of 2021. Partners were encouraged to share their priority cargo transport needs as early as possible with the Logistics Cluster.
