


Highlights

- In July, **53** m³ **(21 mt)** of relief items were received into common storage on behalf of **two organisations** and a total of **2,958** m³ **(1145 mt)** of relief items are stored on behalf of **17 organisations** in Madhu Chara, Balukhali, Unchiprang and Teknaf Hubs.
- The Logistics Sector published the <u>Warehouse Location 2021 map</u> that was the result of the warehouse capacity assessment. Partners can request printed maps in A1 or A0.
- The Logistics Sector in collaboration with the Gender Hub conducted an online gender awareness training for its hub/warehouse staff focusing on Gender Mainstreaming in Bangla.
- The storage services in Balukhali Logistics Hub provided by the Logistics Sector since 2019 will phase out at the end of September 2021. Storage services provided by the Logistics Sector through HI-Atlas will phase out from Teknaf and Unchiprang Logistics Hubs at the end of September 2021. However, HI-Atlas will continue providing storage and transportation services until the end of 2021.
- An <u>ad-hoc Logistics Sector Coordination Meeting</u> was held in response to the flood to discuss transport and storage availability, contingency stocks, Log:ie reporting and 5 MT truck limit in camps where 16 organisations were in attendance. No major concerns were raised.
- Traffic, road blockages due to flooding and access to the camps are being updated in the <u>Log:ie (PAC)</u>. Humanitarians travelling to and planning to enter the camps are requested/encouraged to report via <u>online</u> or <u>offline</u> reporting.
- The Logistics Sector announced the second round of online Logistics Induction Training in collaboration with HI-Atlas focusing on Warehouse, Inventory and Transportation Management in Bangla to be held on the 4 and 5August 2021.
- The Logistics Sector released 10,000 bags to Site Maintenance and Engineering Project (SMEP) to make sandbags to be used in the camps for the flood response.

Background

In 2021, the Logistics Sector will continue working with partners to address common logistics gaps and challenges in Cox's Bazar and ensure an efficient humanitarian response. The Rohingya Response Strategy will maintain its focus on (I)strengthening collaboration amongst international and national partners, (II) synchronising logistics decisions, (III) producing and sharing key information, and (IV) facilitating access to common logistics services to support partners' logistics operations. In the lead-up to

the monsoon and ensuing cyclone seasons, the Logistics Sector focuses its efforts on preparedness activities, planning, and reinforcing partner capacities to support effective decision making, and providing technical logistics advice and access to storage facilities to the organisations facing supply chain challenges.

Coordination & Information Management

- In July, a Coordination Meeting was organised where 26 participants from 21 organisations were in attendance.
- Five Information Management Products have been published on the <u>Logistics Sector website</u> in 2021, including the <u>June Operation Overview</u>, the <u>June Operation Overview Infographic</u>, the <u>Meeting Minutes</u>, the <u>Warehouse Storage Location Map</u> and the <u>Ad Hoc Meeting Minutes</u>.

Logistics services

- In July, **53** m³ of relief items were received into common storage on behalf of **two organisations** making it a total of **2,958** m³ **(1,145 mt)** relief items stored on behalf of **17 organisations** in Madhu Chara, Balukhali, Unchiprang and Teknaf hubs. Items stored include tarpaulins, canopies tents, jerry cans, cement, bookshelves, school benches and face masks.
- Between October 2017 and July 2021, the Logistics Sector received a total of **51,517 m³ (19,480 mt)** relief items on behalf of **45 organisations**.
