

## **Highlights**

- In August, **510** m³ **(116** mt) of relief items were received into common storage on behalf of seven organisations and a total of **3167** m³ **(1072** mt) of relief items are stored on behalf of **19** organisations in Madhu Chara, Balukhali, Unchiprang and Teknaf Hubs. Additional **181** m³ **(6.67** mt) of health items were transported for **two** organisations for flood response.
- The Logistics Sector conducted three rounds of online Logistics Induction Training in collaboration with HI-Atlas focusing on Warehouse, Inventory and Transportation Management in Bangla with 37 participants from 18 organisations in attendance. Five training sessions including Transport Management, Procurement Training, Cyclone Preparedness Drill, and Stock Management Training were conducted by HI-Atlas with 41 participants from ten organisations. In total, 78 humanitarian workers from 26 organisations were trained in August 2021.
- The Logistics Sector prepared and presented the container inspection checklist outlining the considerations for an initial inspection, selecting containers, safekeeping of cargo, as well as placement of cargo inside the container.
- The deadline for the Mid-Year Satisfaction Survey has been extended until 10 September.
- The cleanup process for the new QR codes for the Humanitarian Access Project (HAP) has been finalised, and the system has nearly 3000 humanitarian vehicles registered. Issued passes are now subject to an expiration date.
- The Logistics Sector conducted a Log: IE workshop with the conveyors from HI-Atlas both in English and Bangla. Stickers and cards for vehicles are available from the Logistics Sector. Partners can request further Log: iE training sessions.
- The Access Road Assessment (ARA) in the camps was restarted. To date, twelve camps have been covered.

#### Flood Response Update

- Information on ongoing activities, key infrastructure, and available storage and transport capacity were being collected, consolidated, and shared. Key updates were also being shared via the mailing list and WhatsApp group.
- Traffic, road blockages due to flooding and access to the camps are being updated in the Log:IE (PAC), Log: IE was viewed 269 times, and 13 reports were made during the period of the flood.
- An <u>Ad-hoc Logistics Sector Coordination Meeting</u> was called upon in response to the Flood to discuss transport and storage availability, contingency stocks, LOG: IE reporting and 5 mt truck limit in camps.
- Generators, mobile storage units (MSUs), prefabs, ablution units, tarpaulins, sandbags, ropes, car-kit as well as big wooden and steel boxes are available in the contingency stock for partners.
- Staff were on standby in the Madhu Chara hub overnight to cover any ad-hoc requests.
- Heavy Machines such as Crane, flatbed and Hiab crane have been on standby at the supplier end.
- A map indicating the <u>effect of flood on road access</u> map was published on the <u>Bangladesh Logistics Sector website</u>.

#### **Background**

In 2021, the Logistics Sector continues working with partners to identify common logistics gaps and address challenges in Cox's Bazar and ensure an efficient humanitarian response. The Rohingya Response Strategy will maintain its focus on (I) strengthening collaboration amongst international and national partners, (II) informing and facilitatinig logistics strategic and operational decisions, (III) producing and sharing key information, and (IV) supporting common logistics services delivery to facilitate partners' logistics planned operations. In the lead-up to the monsoon and ensuing cyclone seasons, the Logistics Sector focuses its efforts on preparedness activities, planning, reinforcing partner capacities to support effective decision making, and providing technical logistics advice and access to storage facilities to the organisations facing supply chain challenges.

# **Coordination & Information Management**

- In August, a Coordination Meeting was held where 16 participants from 12 organisations were in attendance.
- Four information management products have been published on the <u>Logistics Sector website</u>, including <u>July Operation</u> Overview, <u>July Operation Overview Infographic</u>, <u>Meeting Minutes</u>, and <u>Ad Hoc Meeting Minutes</u>.

## **Logistics Services**

- In August, **510** m³ **(116** mt) of relief items were received into common storage on behalf of seven organisations and a total of **3167** m³ **(1072** mt) of relief items are stored on behalf of **19** organisations in Madhu Chara, Balukhali, Unchiprang and Teknaf Hubs. Additional **181** m³ **(6.67** mt) of health items were transported for **two** organisations for flood response. Items stored include dignity kits, soaps, and tarpaulins.
- Between October 2017 and August 2021, the Logistics Sector received a total of **52,111** m³ **(19,628 mt)** relief items on behalf of **45 organisations**.
