When the FDA approves a COVID-19 vaccine, full vaccination of anyone eligible for the vaccine will be a condition of entry into American Samoa. All entry permits suspended until further notice with exception of Guest Worker Permits issued for employment at a cannery or call center. Any person entering the territory must register with the online travel program approved by the COVID-19 Task Force, the Department of Health and the Department of Legal Affairs. Regularly scheduled passenger flights to and from American Samoa are suspended. Fiji	Passengers are not permitted to enter or transit through Fiji. This does not apply to nationals and residents of Fiji, Australia or New Zealand, provided that they have downloaded the "careFiji App" when arriving in Fiji. Fiji nationals must hold a negative PCR test obtained within 72 hours prior to departure if they are travelling from a country determined as a high risk for Covid-19, and have confirmed this via <a href="mailto:perezea.ali@govnet.gov.fj">perezea.ali@govnet.gov.fj</a> or <a href="mailto:crmt@govnet.gov.fj">crmt@govnet.gov.fj</a> . Foreign nationals and Fiji residents travelling to Fiji must hold a negative quantitative RT-PCR or Cepheid GeneXpert test certificate obtained within 72 hours prior to departure. The test result must include the laboratory letter head and laboratory contact details, patient details, type of sample collected, date of sample collection, date test was conducted, type of test conducted, lab sample number, and name of lab supervisor/staff signing off on the result. Japan	From March 19, 2021, all travelers including Japanese nationals have to submit a certificate of negative test result conducted within 72 hours (from the sampling time to departure time of the flight) when entering Japan. Those who do not submit a certificate of negative test result will be denied entry into Japan in accordance with the Quarantine Act. Airline companies will reject boarding those without one. Please consult with Embassies or Consulates or Consular Office of Japan in case it is truly difficult to obtain the certificate of negative test result. Japan	From January 14, 2021 until further notice, all Japanese nationals and foreign nationals with the status of residence are also required to pledge to refrain from using public transportation for 14 days, and to be in quarantine at home or other designated areas for 14 days, retain the location data, and provide it to the health centers or other institutions, if requested. (If separate quarantine measures are to be taken, those also need to be pledged.) They are required to sign and submit the Written Pledge(PDF) Open a New Window when entering Japan. In case of violation, they may be subject to detention under Quarantine Act and the following shall apply: ( i ) For Japanese nationals, names and other information that contribute to preventing the spread of infection may be made public. ( ii ) For foreign nationals with the status of residence, names, nationalities, and other information that contribute to preventing the spread of infection may be made public. They may also be subject to the revocation of status of residence and procedures for deportation under Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Law. Those who do not submit the "Written Pledge" are requested to stay at a location designated by the Chief of the Quarantine Station (only at the accommodation booked by the quarantine office) for 14 days. Palau	Travelers must submit proof of complete COVID-19 vaccination with final dose administered at least fourteen (14) days prior to departure to the Republic. Vaccine received must be approved or authorized for emergency use by either the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) or the World Health Organization (WHO). *For commercial air travel, travelers must submit proof to the airline. All Travelers must also provide proof of either: A negative result of a COVID-19 PCR test (any type of PCR test, including NAAT, RT-PCR, qPCR, RT-LAMP, TMA, molecular test, isothermal amplification, ddPCR, or CRISPR), and such test must be taken within three (3) days prior to departure from the point of origin to the Republic; or Documentation of recovery from COVID-19 which includes proof of a recent positive viral test and a letter from a healthcare provider or a public health official stating that you have recovered and are cleared to travel. *For commercial air travel, travelers must submit proof to the airline. All Travelers shall be COVID tested on the first (1st) day following their arrival to the Republic and are required to follow the Mitigation Orders issued upon arrival. PRE-ARRIVAL COVID-19 TESTING – As stated in Public Health Directive 27-21, all travelers are required to provide valid negative PCR COVID-19 test results taken within three (3) days of departure to Palau or proof of COVID-19 recovery if previously infected with COVID-19. Children under three (3) years old are exempt from this pre-arrival testing requirement; however, all passengers are subject to the 2 tests after arrival in Palau. PROOF OF FULL COVID-19 VACCINATION – Consistent with Public Health Directive 27-21, travelers must provide proof of complete vaccination of a WHO or US FDA approved or authorized COVID-19 vaccine with final dose at least fourteen (14) days prior to arrival in Palau, or enter pursuant to Section 1(c) of the Public Health Directive (Entry for Residents of Authorized Jurisdiction Under Special Conditions). MANDATORY DAY 1 AND DAY 5 COVID-19 TESTING – All inbound travelers shall be subject to Mitigation Orders that include undergo mandatory COVID-19 testing on the first (1st) and fifth (5th) day following arrival in Palau. Testing shall occur at the Belau National Hospital between 8:00am – 10:30am. COVID-19 testing cost is \$30.50 per test. Papua New Guinea	Commercial options for travel to and from Papua New Guinea remain very limited. If transiting through another country, it is important that you also check the latest requirements for transit through that country. Nobody may enter Papua New Guinea unless they are fully vaccinated, have written exemption from the National Pandemic Controller or his delegate, and evidence of a negative Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) test result for COVID-19 taken within a 7 day period prior to boarding the aircraft bound for Papua New Guinea. You should arrange to take a private test. International visitors should apply for their exemption to enter Papua New Guinea by emailing the National Control Centre Travel Desk at covid19-travel@police.gov.pg with the following documents completed: International Air Passenger Travel Form (I-APTF) • letter to the National Pandemic Controller, including your reason for travel, visa details, passport details (including the expiry date) and, if applicable, your work permit details (or letter from your employer) and/or resident permit details • copy of your passport biodata page • copy of your visa for Papua New Guinea and, if applicable, a copy of your work permit and/or resident permit • copy of your reservation at a designated hotel for quarantine or home quarantine request (as applicable) You should submit your completed documents at least two weeks prior to travel. You will need to show evidence of your vaccination, approved exemptions, negative COVID-19 test and hotel reservation to be allowed to board a flight to Papua New Guinea. You must also complete an online electronic health declaration form prior to departure. The barcode generated should be saved and provided at check-in as evidence of submission of the online form. Anyone arriving in Papua New Guinea must self-isolate – at their own expense – in a government approved hotel for 21 days and undertake COVID-19 tests on days 1, 7 and 21 of the quarantine period. All arrivals will also be subject to monitoring through either an approved tracking device or tracking application at their own cost. Singapore	All travellers with recent travel history to higher risk countries/regions will be required to serve a 21-day Stay Home Notice (SHN) at dedicated facilities. Travellers who are currently serving a 14-day SHN and have yet to complete their SHN by 7 May 2021, 11.59pm will be required to serve an additional 7 days at their current SHN location. All travellers serving their 21-day SHN will undergo the COVID-19 Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) tests on-arrival, on Day 14 of their SHN, and another test before the end of their 21-day SHN period.
