1. Action Points Review

The action points from the Coordination Meeting on 19 October were reviewed:

- Logistics Cluster to continue to share updates on access restrictions following the recent flooding across Somalia (road and airstrip accessibility), specifically on Jowhar. – **[ONGOING]**

2. Situation Update

- The updated [Roads Access map](#) and [Airport Access map](#) (as of 1 November) are available on the [Logistics Cluster Somalia webpage](#).
- Access challenges that are affecting cross border operations, inland transport, and airlift operations were discussed:
 - Some roads in the South of Somalia (ex-Mogadishu) are closed or constrained
 - Since 19 October, Jalalaqsi airport is flooded and inaccessible due to the rains. The runway typically requires 5 days to dry due to the type of soil. Due to the ongoing rains, this is proving to be a challenge
 - Baidoa airport still has a cutoff time due. Flights can only operate between 07:30-12:00
 - Dinsoor airport is only open on Monday and Thursdays
- All ports remain operational. WFP time-chartered vessel MV Spiekeroog is currently in **Djibouti**. Partners were reminded to share requests for Sea transport early to allow time for the different process.

3. Cargo Transport Requirements

- The Logistics Cluster has facilitated the delivery of 1,567 mt of cargo on behalf of eleven organizations in 2021.
- The Logistics Cluster has cumulatively facilitated the transport of 1,948 mt of cargo for 16 organizations since its activation in April 2020.

4. Guri Ceel Displacement Briefing

- Clashes were reported in Guri Ceel town in Galmudug State from 23 -26 October causing the displacement of over 100,000 people, the disruption of supply of electricity, water, health services and schools.
- Access challenges increased in the areas of need, hindering humanitarian response
- Local authorities have **appealed for urgent food, shelter, non-food items, water and sanitation (WASH), health, nutrition and protection assistance** for the affected people.
- Efforts are underway to fully reconnect electricity and water supplies and health services have partially resumed and as of 31 October, about 30 per cent of the displaced people have returned to the town.
- A joint inter-agency and state inter cluster assessment mission will take place on 3 and 4 November to further assess the impact of the conflict, needs and response gaps.
