1. Logistics Sector Updates

- The Cox's Bazar COVID-19 Special Hub comprising five MSUs with an area of 1280 m² and temperature-controlled storage with an area of 370 m², is now open for all humanitarian agencies. It has been handed over to Handicap International-Atlas Logistique. The hub received four consignments including oxygen and PPE items (gowns and surgical masks) from three partners including Food for the Hungry (FH), World Food Programme (WFP) and Handicap International (HI).
- Storage space is available in Madhu Chara, Balukhali, Teknaf and Uchiprang logistics hubs as well. Partners interested in transporting cargo and/or storing relief items in all five hubs are requested to fill out the [Service Request Form](#) and send it at bangladesh.clustercargo@wfp.org.
- Uttam Das has been appointed as the Logistics Associate- Hub Manager.
- [Mid-term Logistics Sector Satisfaction Survey](#) has been launched. This survey covers all Logistics Sector activities including Coordination, Information Management, Common Storage Services provision and Preparedness. Partners are requested to answer the survey by 8th July 2020.

2. (WHO) Supply Portal Updates

- The Supply Chain Coordinator conducted a brief information session on the structures and level of the Global Supply Chain System. Roles and responsibilities of the various coordination and operational groups including the Supply Chain Task Force, the Supply Chain Interagency Cell, the Buying Consortia, the Control Tower and the Online Portal System were summarised.
- Currently, 14 requests from five partners in Bangladesh worth approximately US\$27m have been validated in the system. Now waiting for the Control Tower to link requestors with the global level procurement entities to have them allocate, make arrangements for fund transfer and provide estimated delivery schedules for requested items. The requestor is expected to be contacted by the Control Tower in the coming week.
- Upon request from partners to obtain an overview of the existing gap for PPE and medical equipment, the Supply Chain Coordinators recently compiled interagency stock and pipeline data for the 57 WHO catalogue COVID 19 items. The purpose of the activity is to compare the PPE and medical material existing and incoming stocks with the initial WHO specified overall needs, to support informed agency planning. Stock and pipeline information were contributed by the stakeholders of the exercise including six UN agencies and three NGOs: UNHCR, IOM, UNICEF, WHO, WFP, UNFPA, International Rescue Committee (IRC), The International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) and Save the Children (STC). A summary of the data will be circulated with the minutes.

3. AOB

- There are currently three commercial airlines operating flights in and out of Dhaka. With the increase in commercial services, it is less likely that WFP will proceed with the passenger air bridge from Dhaka to KL, which is still awaiting consideration for approval from the Bangladesh government.
- Air Cargo services are able to deliver to Bangladesh.
