



SITUATION UPDATES

- The selection of members for the president council has been agreed upon, but the approval is pending.
- Violences and confrontation concentrated in Port-au-Prince; other major cities are experiencing sporadic security incidents.
- Displacement- 360,000 people are internally displaced in country, from March 8 to March 27.
- Humanitarian partners have experienced delays or suspensions in their distribution operations.
- Over 300 aid containers currently stranded at the Port-au-Prince port, under threat of looting.
Efforts ongoing to accelerate the customs clearance process.



LOGISTICS UPDATES

Road access

- Roads from Port-au-Prince to departments remains blocked, risks of landside transport has increased. Private transport companies are attempting to arrange ad hoc trips.
- Barricades erected in multiple districts within the metropolitan area of PaP which hampered the access to the warehouses and access to IDP sites
- Road to Dominican Republic is closed and the border crossing point is closed for cargo.

Air transport

- International flights to PaP are cancelled, some low-cost airlines resuming flights (to Miami) from Cap-Haitien International airport.
- Airspace from Dominican Republic to Haiti remains closed, some commercial helicopters and UNHAS flights are used for evacuation purposes

Sea transport

- The International Port of Port-au-Prince (APN) not fully operational and Caribbean Port Services (CPS), customs services are sporadic.
- Mirogoane Port is operational and customs services available but cannot handle containerized cargo.
- Port of Saint Louie de Sud is operational and customs services available.
- Lafito Port is not operational.

LOGISTICS SECTOR RESPONSE



■ Coordination and Information Management

- Weekly Cluster coordination meetings at country and field level
- Support health cluster and ministry of health in developing the health supply chain response plan
- Log.IE - Access Constraints Map regularly updated based on partners updates
- Situation updates regularly published on website

■ Operations

- Logistics Sector chartered vessel (food, medicines) from Port-au-Prince to Gonaives on 30 March and from Port-au-Prince to Miragone on 12 March
- Ongoing preparation for humanitarian convoys to extract aid containers from seaport in collaboration with humanitarian access working group and cell of dialogue and liaison with security actors
- Support partners in accelerating the customs clearance process
- Assessing temporary storage capacity in Cap-Haitien. Call partners to look at downstream plans to avoid congestion in Cap Haitien and reinforce capacity in the long term.

UPDATES FROM PARTNERS



▪ AIRLINK

- Looking into the possibility of flying cargo to the Dominican Republic.
- Discussions ongoing on road transport from Santo Domingo to Cap Haitien.

▪ ECHO

- A flight supported by ECHO is planned from Panama to Haiti. No fixed departure dates yet.
- ECHO is exploring sea transport options.

▪ HUMENICA INTERNATIONAL

- No international staff presence in the country.
- Implementing through local partners (NNGO).
- Medical stocks are running low as no supplies are coming in.

▪ LOGISTICS EMERGENCY TEAM (LET)

- LET Members are on standby for support in case partners need it.

▪ PAHO

- Planning to reposition stock in the Dominican Republic to move urgent medical cargo into Haiti with UNHAS flights.

▪ SOLIDARITE INTERNATIONAL

- Handling wash activities, sanitation, sheltering, and distribution.
- No international importation of products. Supplies from the local market. Facing daily price increases and limited access to suppliers.

▪ UNHAS

- Helicopters are temporarily based in the Turks and Caicos, flying from there to Cap Haitien.
- Four rotations made in the past 2 days, with more rotations planned.
- Flights serve for evacuation/relocation and for resupplying light cargo (inbound and outbound from PaP).
- Flights are open for normal booking with standard UNHAS procedures.
- UNHAS has been cleared to fly between the Dominican Republic and Haiti; flights may be established.
- Small fixed-wing aircraft based in Santo Domingo. User groups will decide to operate this aircraft also for passenger flights from Cap Haitien to Jamaica and other countries in the region.

▪ UNHRD

- Air shipment being organized from Panama to Cap Haitien depot with the support of ECHO for 2 partners (PAHO and IOM)
- Sea shipment being organized from Panama to Cap Haitien for 1 partner (PAHO)


▪ UNICEF

- Consolidating and repositioning cargo (medical kits) in Panama to be airlifted to PaP through ECHO flights.
- Needs are increasing, and stock is insufficient in the South.
- Challenge of restocking partners based in the South due to road access constraints from/to PaP. Interest in exploring the possibility of a sea corridor from Cap Haitien.

▪ USAID/BHA

- Advocate for partners to use the Dominican Republic as a storage area for Haiti and regional response.
