- Context: 1.1 million people targeted in the HNRP Flash Addendum for the Myanmar EQ response. Overall requirements USD 275M, Logistics Cluster requirements USD 2.7M.
- Priority on life-saving protection, Shelter/NFI, MPC and WASH support in the hardest hit communities
- On 13 April, 5.5 magnitude (34 km NNE of Meiktila). No major damages reported yet.
- As per weather forecast, rain/thundershowers are likely to be scattered in Sagaing Region, Kachin State and Naypyitaw, Yangon, Mandalay until 17 April 2025.

Logistics Cluster updates:

- The Logistics Cluster Concept of Operations (ConOps) is published.
- Establishment of logistics hub and common storage space in Mandalay is ongoing.



Landside: Visualize physical access constraints on LogIE

From Yangon to Naypyitaw,

- o it takes 4.5 hours for light vehicles only. The Swa bridge (milepost 163~165) remains heavily damaged and one lane open (traffic delays)
- 12 hours for cargoes loaded trailer (including inspection, waiting times and resting stops).

From Naypyitaw to Mandalay,

- it takes 3.5 hours for light vehicles. Some bumpy areas when existing NPT afterwards the road is fine until you
 encounter a damage bridge (Bailey bridge near milepost 346~347) before arriving Mandalay. Detour to old Mandalay
 road passing Pa Leik town of Sint Kaing township and Tada-U airport area.
- 6~8 hours for cargoes loaded trailer (including inspection, waiting times and resting stops).
- Less traffic during the Thingyan holiday.

Sea/River:

No major updates, river level remains low until June.

Air infrastructure

- Yangon Airport (RGN): Open, can operate as before Refer to the website of <u>AIP Myanmar</u>
- Nay Pyi Taw Airport (NYT): relief flights and domestics flights are operating. Refer to the website of AIP Myanmar
- Mandalay Airport (MDL): relief flights (Boeing 737, C 17, 24 hours) and domestics flights (daytime, from 6 AM to 6 PM) are operating. International flight operation is anticipated to resume in the last week of April but still need to be confirmed.



Airlifts:

EUHAB flights updates.

Customs Clearance:

- The Customs Department will ensure smooth operations during the holiday period. Customs clearance for air and sea routes will be expedited on 15/04 and 19/04, with overtime services available if needed.
- Currently mapping partner's process for importation/customs

Storage

• The Logistics Cluster is securing storage space in Mandalay (about 1,000 sq.meter)

Updates from Partners


- Airlink:. Chartered a flight from Kuala Lumpur (KL) with 50 MT of cargo on behalf of a partner. Looking to transport smaller cargo on commercial flights where and when possible.
- A partner has concluded a fourth flight with ECHO, making it a total of four flights, around 120 MT of aid transported. These flights were from UNHRD KL into Yangon
- UNHRD: has supported several partners for cargo flights in the last weeks




