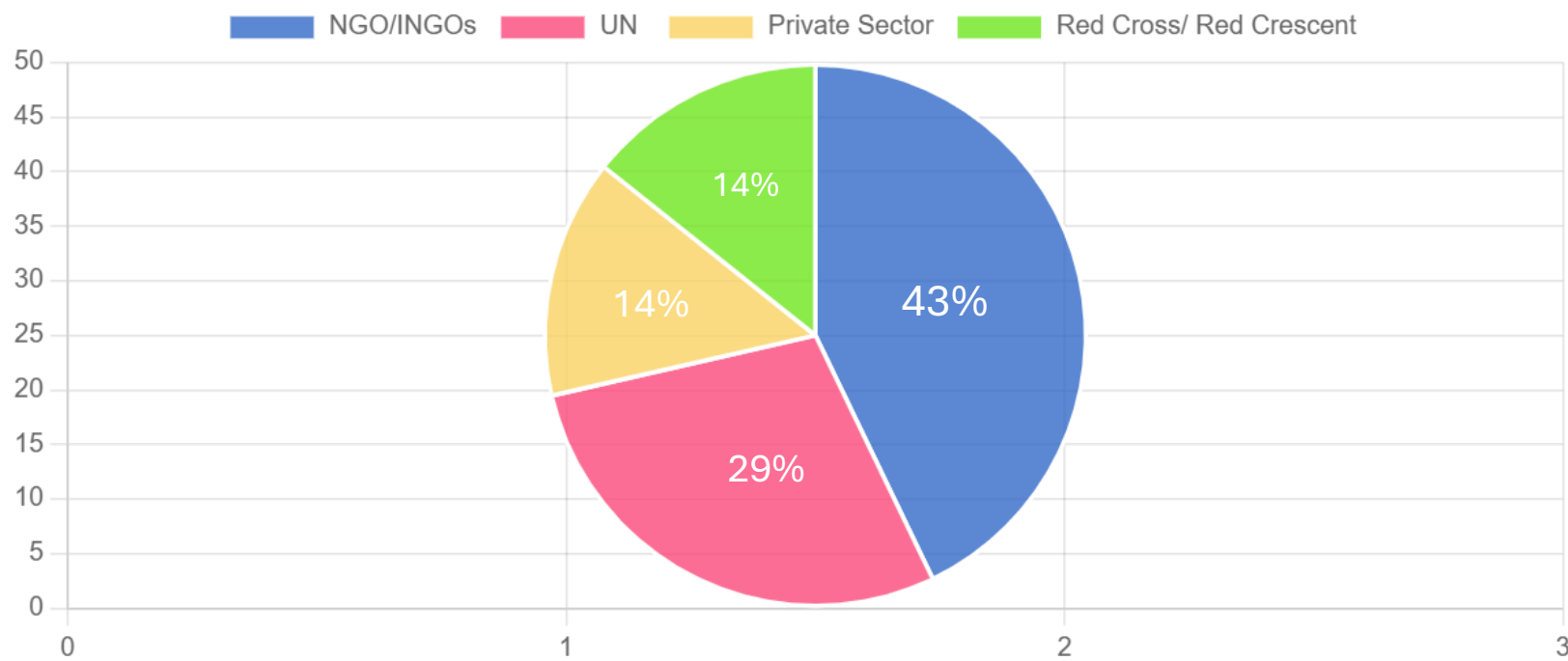

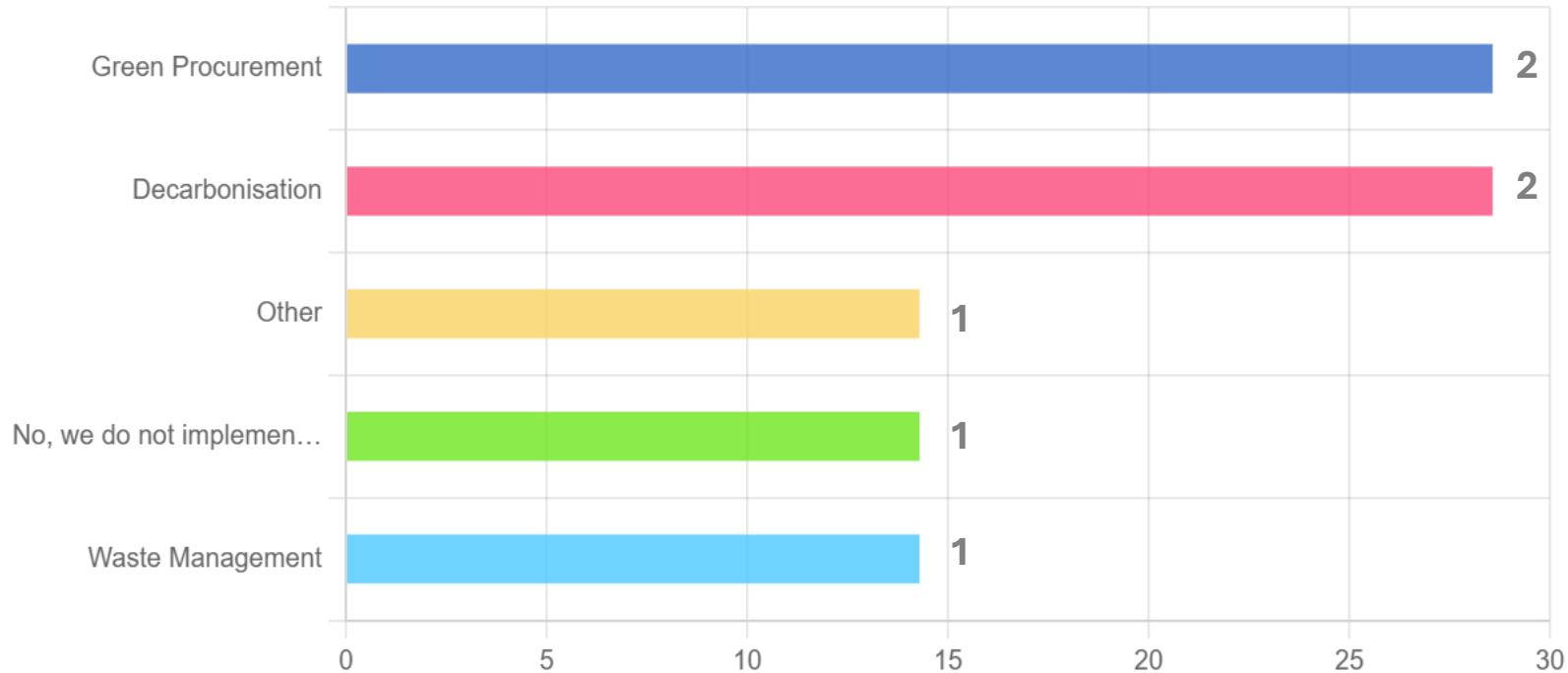

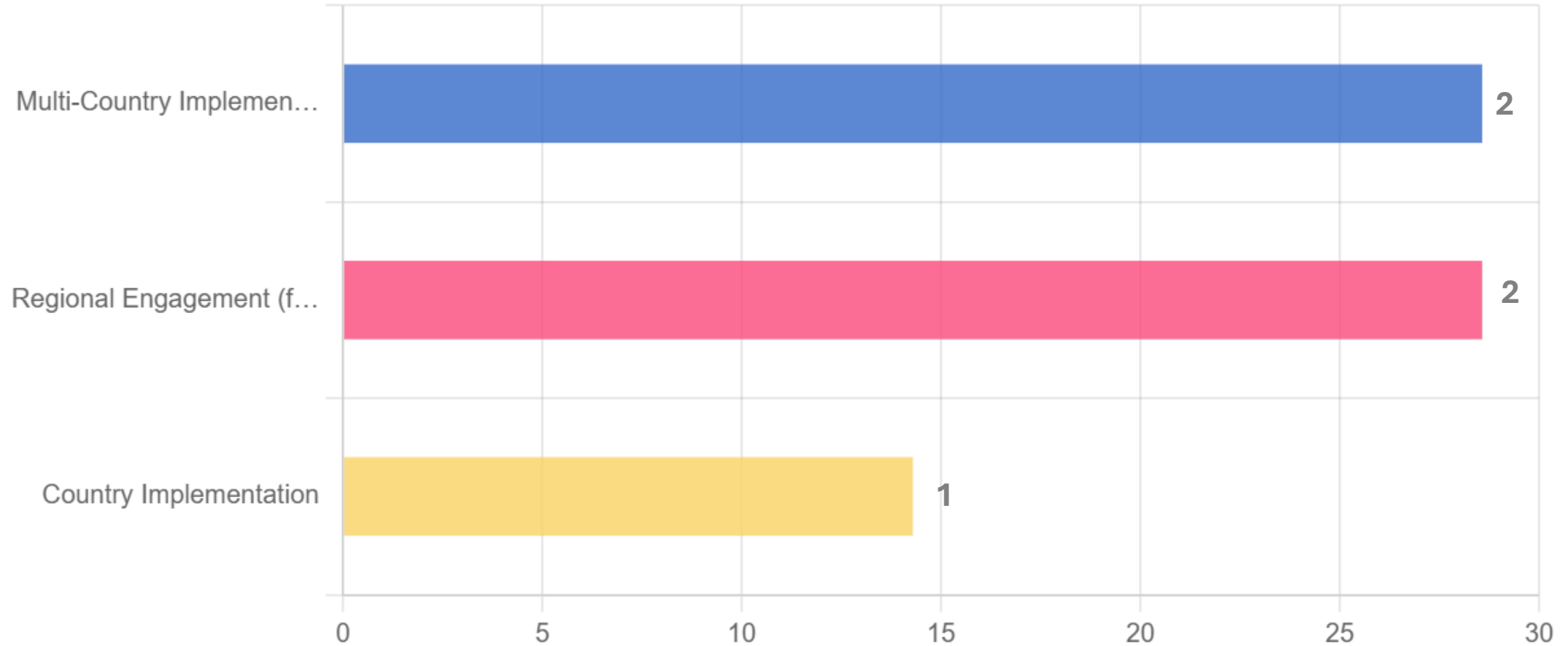
# Initiative 1: Environmental Sustainability in Humanitarian Supply Chain & Logistics 🌱



## Brief current/planned initiatives

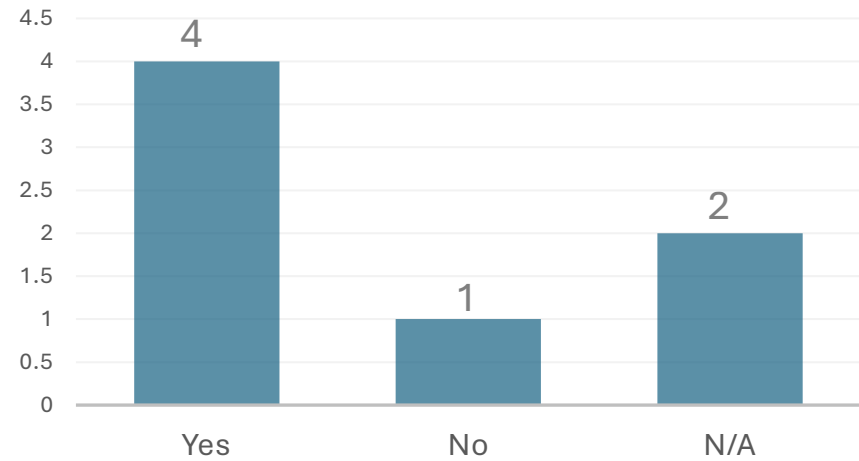
- Greening Disaster Logistics: logistics planning supports sustainable disaster response, aligning with national preparedness goals.
- Carbon-Smart Prepositioning: STOCKHOLM enhances strategy coordination with data on time, cost, and—by mid-2025—carbon emissions savings, driving environmentally responsible logistics.
- Under the Pacific Humanitarian Warehousing program, the WREC coalition promotes sustainable waste management in warehouse operations to build resilient, eco-friendly supply chains across the Pacific.

Volunteer-Support Response & Airport Readiness: DRT volunteers and the GARD initiative enhance frontline logistics and airport disaster response capacities.



Localised Resilience in Remote Islands: MRCS ensures pre-positioned relief stocks across FSM States, enabling swift, localised aid delivery despite infrastructure challenges.



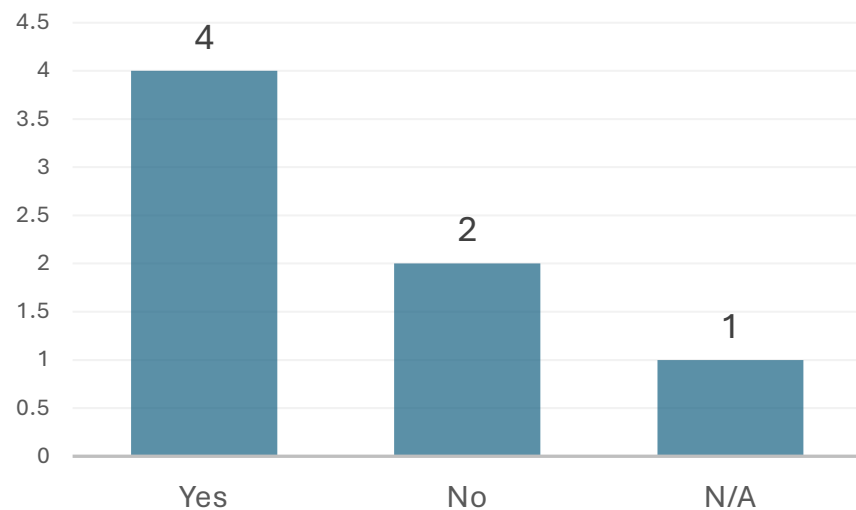
Collaborative Supply Networks: ESUPS advances joint planning through shared logistics models and empowers national actors in coordinated stock prepositioning.



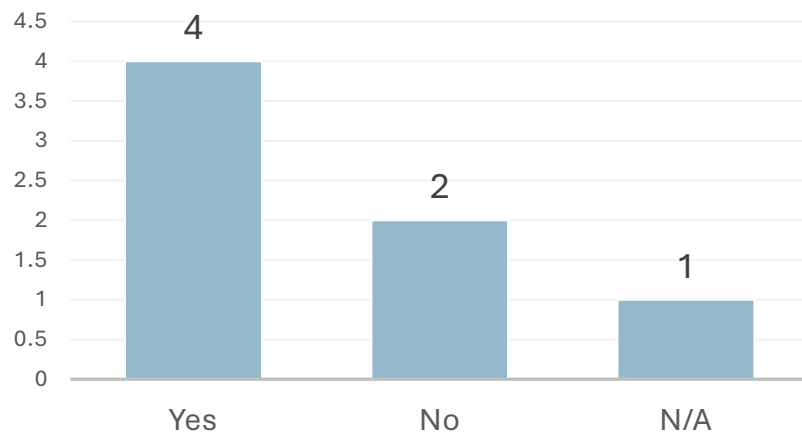

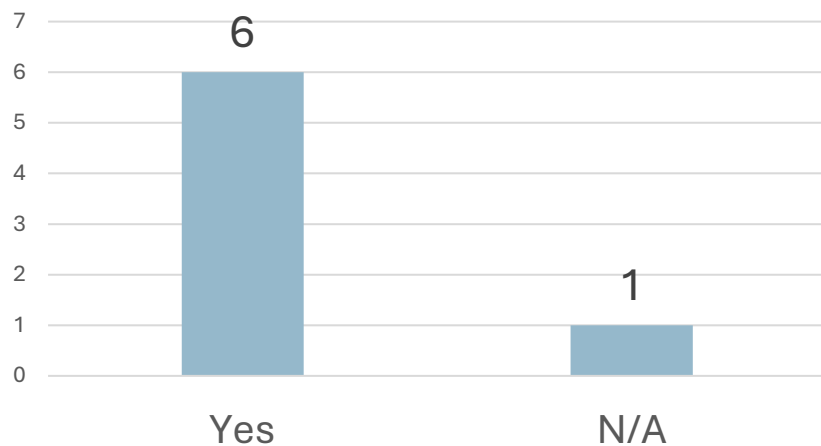


### Brief current/planned initiatives

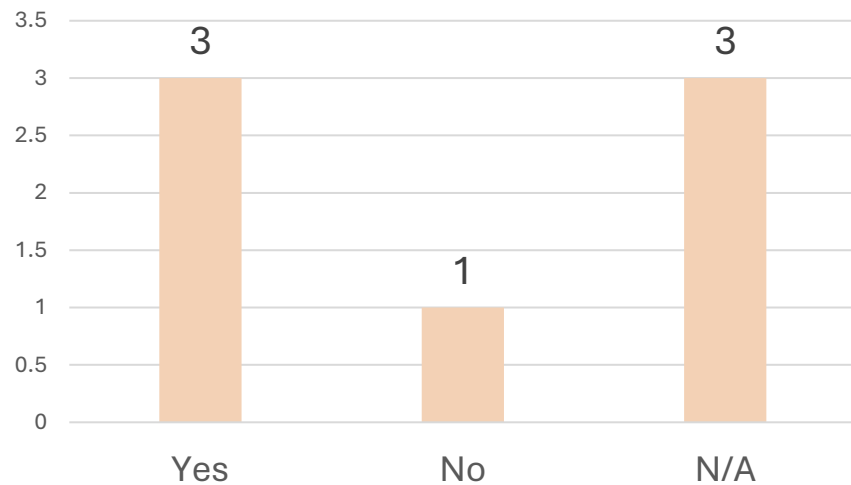
- Expanding access to free or discounted humanitarian airlift.
- Strengthening partnerships at all levels to coordinate and leverage resources effectively.
- Delivering regional workshops to build capacity, foster collaboration, and promote resource pooling.
- Developing Humanitarian Logistics Academy – piloting in 2025
- Ensuring flexible access to emergency supplies through local and international sourcing.
- Promoting national leadership and collaborative planning with tools and training.
- Launching in 2025: trainings, Simex, process mapping, and clear ToRs to boost efficiency and define roles.

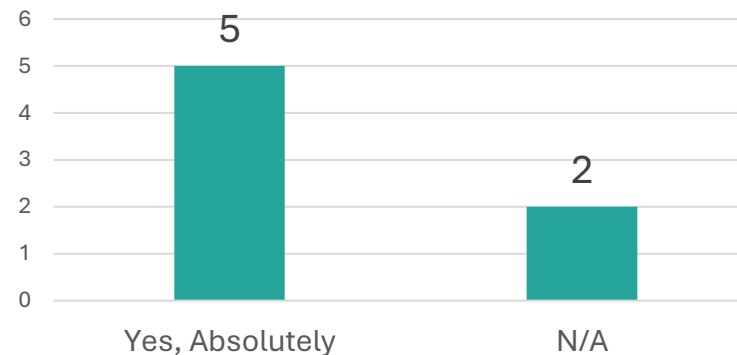
