Situation Updates

- o Inputs for Draft concept note for the **Myanmar Earthquake After Action Review** being consolidated by ICCG/HCT.
- o **Subnational Coordination Review Process** ongoing. 1st phase Survey circulated and due by 7 July.
- o 2026 Humanitarian Programme Cycle (HPC) planning process discussion kicked off.
- o Potential risks resulting from heavy rainfall and natural disasters such as strong winds, thunder, lightning, hail, flash floods, and landslides expected to occur between 23-29 June across the country.



Transition strategy

Gaps and Needs Assessment (GNA)

- Bilateral interviews conducted with partners to reassess the initial GNA results
- Findings indicates no more logistics gaps on storage and transport
- Most of the storage needs largely met by partners and commercial sector

Way forward

- Formal Cluster deactivation by the end of **June 2025** & Phase out of Common services
- Transition into a Logistics Working Group/Sector and focus on emergency logistics preparedness
- Coordination, Information Management, and high-level advocacy remains relevant



Partners' Updates


- One partner facilitated 4 consignments of medical supplies to Yangon for NGO counterparts


