1. Updates from LWG

- LWG is currently providing support to partners on coordination and Information Management (IM)
 - Coordination on customs information and advocating on behalf of humanitarian organizations; discuss logistics operational constraints and opportunities with authorities at National and Governorate level, provide opportunities for coordination among partners to use the expertise and resources available; organize regular coordination meetings; and provide bilateral support as required
 - IM: [Log.ie](https://logcluster.org/en/lbn24a) page is active and updates, as well as other IM products. Additional support is expected to scale up the IM functions further.
- A Logistics Operational Plan is being drafted, for which different scenarios are currently being considered:
 - Common services for consolidation of cargo and organization of convoys: This is still being assessed based on funding availability, agreement amongst partners on the needs, and the current notification system structure.

- WFP can already provide immediate On Demand Services (ODS) services for storage and transport, but needs review/signature of MOUs with partners
- The Logistics Working Group is providing access to regional coordination structures and information platforms, considering the nature of the crisis affecting the region ([Log.ie Regional](#))
- The Logistics Cluster’s Global team highlighted that shipping and air transport are impacted by the ongoing events in the region, land transportation challenges are not reported but will be further monitored to provide potential solutions in case of need, particularly considering the limited availability of entry points in Lebanon at the moment.
- Access to affected locations in Lebanon is considered the main challenge by humanitarian partners, considering the fluidity of the security context and the need for close coordination with several actors to ensure the safe delivery of cargo to hard-to-reach areas.
- The Logistics Working Group announced that a survey will be sent to evaluate the needs of partners, particularly the potential destinations in hard-to-reach areas.

Infrastructure Update

- Al Masnaa/Jdidet Yabus border crossing was temporarily closed today but reopened the same afternoon
- Port is operational- no disruptions reported yet. However, the constraints in regional supply routes, are causing roll-over at the port and may lead to further bottlenecks. The Logistics Working is monitoring closely to ensure information is available to act accordingly if needed.
- Beirut Airport is operational from a ground operations perspective, but commercial airlines are cancelling daily, both passengers and cargo flights, due to the closure of airspace.

Fuel Update

- No changes in status on the availability of fuel in country, no major pipeline disruptions reported so far but closely monitoring and sending updates frequently considering the risks involved.

2. Updates from Partners

- Partners reported cargo flights being cancelled and first notices of delays with shipments at the port.
- Partners are in the process of designing their operational plan, as the access situation remains very fluid. They are currently working on assessments to determine the needs and plan logistics activities accordingly.
- There are concerns regarding partner’s ability to access their warehouses due to insecure routes, therefore highlighting the need for support on immediate storage of small quantities.
- OCHA Access Working Group pointed out to the Humanitarian Notification System (HNS) is active as per standard procedures. Several partners were interested on obtaining more information related to inter agency convoys, considering the challenges faced by organizations to coordinate the process.
 - LWG and the OCHA Access Working Group are collaborating to define the best solution for partners to reach the identified locations. It is important the humanitarian actors engage with both mechanisms to define the areas to be reached and the potential volumes required.
 - Notification system for the North Litani River (NLR) is also active, and the Access Working Group is defining the details with some organizations for a first convoy using the HNS in the LNR.

- Partners are interested in using the knowledge available amongst the partners regarding regional convoys and cross border operations with Syria. Several organizations have historical knowledge on this and are willing to discuss in a dedicated group. The Logistics Working Group will take forward this initiative.
- There is interest to share warehouse capacity for small quantities of medical supplies that may need temperature-controlled storage.
