OUR HISTORY Formed in the UK by Felix Barrett in 2000, Punchdrunk has pioneered a game-changing form of immersive theatre in which roaming audiences experience epic and emotional storytelling inside sensory theatrical worlds. Blending classical texts, physical performance, award-winning design installation, and unexpected sites, the company's infectious format rejects the passive obedience usually expected of audiences. Our award-winning productions invite audiences to rediscover the childlike excitement and anticipation of exploring the unknown and experience a real sense of adventure. The company's international production, *Sleep No More*, has celebrated 10 years of its extended run in the USA. In December 2016, a redeveloped version of the production opened in Shanghai and continues to run. *The Third Day*, a six part TV drama and theatrical broadcast created by Dennis Kelly and Felix Barrett aired on Sky and HBO earlier this year. Punchdrunk also announced a partnership with gaming giants Niantic last year.

Punchdrunk's award-winning productions include *Faust* (in collaboration with the National Theatre, 2006), *The Masque of the Red Death* (2008), *Tunnel 228* (in collaboration with The Old Vic, 2009), *It Felt Like A Kiss* (with Adam Curtis and Damon Albarn, Manchester International Festival, 2009), *Sleep No More* (with the American Repertory Theatre, Boston, Mass., 2009), *The Duchess of Malfi* (with ENO, 2010), *The Crash of the Elysium* (Manchester International Festival, 2011) and *The Drowned Man: A Hollywood Fable* (with the National Theatre, 2013). Since 2008, Punchdrunk Enrichment has taken this immersive practice into communities, creating performances with and for children, young people and the wider community.

THE ROLE

Punchdrunk is seeking a talented Carpenter to make scenic items, furniture and props for Punchdrunk's productions and related projects and to contribute to the creation of the highest standards in all the theatre's producing work.

The Production Department

The purpose of the Production Department is to create and run to the highest standards all the technical aspects of Punchdrunk's productions and related projects, in partnership with the directors, designers and project leaders, to help creative teams achieve their artistic vision within the agreed timescales and budgets.

Members of the Production department work closely and collaboratively together to realise the full potential of our productions. As a member of the team, whilst working primarily in the area of production, you will demonstrate an ability and willingness to work on occasions alongside colleagues in other areas within the team.

JOB DESCRIPTION | RESPONSIBILITIES INCLUDE:

Production Responsibilities

- To assist in the building of the theatre spaces
- To assist in the realisation of technical requirements for the production
- To provide support to the Production Department during installation
- To undertake prep work and sourcing for production as required
- To support the SSM with the upkeep and organisation of Punchdrunk storage
- To work with the Carpenters on the building of scenery

Department Responsibilities

- To actively contribute to the effective operation of the Production Department's work
- To support the HSC and SSM in the effective management of the Production Department
- To oversee the Health and Safety and management of casual workshop staff
- To ensure that all workshop equipment and machinery is regularly checked and complies with current legislation
- To actively take part in the maintenance of workshop equipment and facilities

- To undertake the training of staff in the use of workshop equipment as required
- To advise the HSC and SSM on anticipated maintenance costs
- To participate in department administrative and HR systems as required
- To help ensure that all production operations are carried out in compliance with relevant and applicable Health and Safety legislation and any other applicable statutory regulations or legislation
- To remain current with industry best practices and applicable technologies
- To continually seek out opportunities to adapt our working practices to make things better for team members and incoming creative teams
- To provide training and inductions to other members of the production team where necessary
