ABOUT LONDON THEATRE COMPANY

ABOUT THE BRIDGE THEATRE

The Bridge is London Theatre Company's first new theatre. It has a stunning riverside location on the south bank of the Thames, right by Tower Bridge and five minutes' walk from the transport hub of London Bridge station. It is designed by Haworth Tompkins, winners of the 2014 RIBA Stirling Prize for Liverpool's Everyman Theatre. It has 900+ seats and can be configured in end-stage, thrust and promenade formats.

The Bridge opened for the first time in October 2017, and since then has produced a variety of plays, including A German Life, a one-woman show starring Maggie Smith, and A Midsummer Night's Dream, an immersive reimagining of Shakespeare's classic. My Name is Lucy Barton, performed by Laura Linney, which originally opened at the Bridge Theatre in June 2018, then transferred to Broadway in January 2020.

ABOUT THIS ROLE

The Head of Stage will lead on stage operational management, will be responsible for the stage /rigging delivery and maintenance.

The Head of Stage will work within Health and Safety management to deliver complete legislation and contractual compliance to all elements of on stage activities.

This role will be expected to set up procedures for the stage, surrounding areas, and procedures for the stages team including full time and casual colleagues.

The role will be part of the Bridge Theatre senior working team.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILTIES

The Head of Stage will undertake the following responsibilities however this is not a finite list of roles. The Head of Stage will be expected to undertake any such task that is required as a senior member of a producing house. Candidates can expect the following to fall within their remit:

- Facilitating the stage staff requirements for each production or event at The Bridge Theatre, which may include occasional foyer events and filming requirements
- Alongside the LTC senior management team, with Directors, Designers, Production Managers to oversee the implementation and ongoing operation of LTC produced productions, including incoming productions.
- To oversee the recruitment and management of permanent staff.
- To take the lead responsibility for offsite storage facilities. Maintaining an up to date record of assets.
- To ensure all stage equipment, rigging and machinery is regularly inspected
- To have a understanding of the building facilities, with a general knowledge the BMS
