Qualification Overview

The OCNLR Level 3 Certificate in Creating and Sustaining a Business has been developed in consultation with the Adult Enterprise Partnership, a group of experienced business advisers, colleges and adult community learning providers. This qualification is one of a suite of qualifications that have been designed to provide support to people who are in the process of creating, launching, sustaining and growing a new business and has been designed also to serve as a progression from the OCNLR Level 2 Certificate in First Steps to Enterprise.

The OCNLR Level 3 Certificate in Creating and Sustaining a Business will support learners with the acquisition of the key knowledge and skills necessary to support the sustainable creation and development of a business. The teaching and assessment methodology for this qualification is based on the premise of direct relation to the learner's own business.

The OCNLR Level 3 Certificate in Creating and Sustaining a Business is regulated by Ofqual, the qualifications regulator for England, and is registered on the Regulated Qualifications Framework (RQF).

Purpose of the qualification

The purpose of the OCNLR Level 3 Certificate in Creating and Sustaining a Business is to provide a framework of learning for adult entrepreneurs to support to create, grow and sustain a business.

The three mandatory units in this qualification will support learners to prepare and implement a business plan, forecast income and expenditure of their business, select an appropriate financial monitoring system, understand their position regarding HMRC, establish a pricing structure and use branding to position a product or service in the market.

The optional units then offer the learners a broad range of knowledge and skills, covering areas such as selecting a business model, launching and managing an on-line business, using social media for marketing and promotion, health and safety, business legislation, business presentation skills and recruiting employees.

Who the qualification is for

The OCNLR Level 3 Certificate in Creating and Sustaining a Business is suitable for anyone who considers themselves to have a viable business idea and needs support in taking the idea forward to establish, and ensure the sustainability of, a registered business. Learners may be progressing from the OCNLR Level 2 Certificate in First Steps to Enterprise.

Entry guidance

The minimum age for access to the qualification is 16 years.

Progression and related qualifications

This qualification is one of a suite of OCN London qualifications to support enterprise development, with a view to providing grounding in the knowledge and skills needed to be successful in setting up and running a business.

Structure of the Qualification

Rules of combination for achievement

The OCNLR Level 3 Certificate in Creating and Sustaining a Business comprises three mandatory units and a number of optional vocational units. Learners must achieve 27 credits in total:

- 9 credits from the mandatory units;
- the remaining 18 credits from the optional vocational units.

Assessment and Moderation

Assessment process

The assessment process for this qualification is as follows:

- the learners are assessed through activities that are internally set by tutor/assessors:
- the activities must be designed to enable learners to meet the assessment criteria
- learners' portfolios of assessed evidence must be internally moderated at the Centre;
- the portfolios of assessed evidence will be externally moderated by an OCN London External Moderator.

There is no additional external assessment for this qualification.

Devising assessments

Each unit has a supplementary page with suggestions for the types of assessment activities that can be used to assess learners against the unit. Tutor/assessors should refer to this page before devising assessment tasks.

OCN London assessment guidance relevant to the units in the qualification is in the OCNLR Assessment Guidance and Ofqual Level Descriptors section of this qualification guide. The guidance includes a general description of the activity and the type of evidence that is appropriate. The activity or activities set must enable the learners to meet the standards detailed in the assessment criteria. Please contact OCN London for further guidance on devising appropriate assessments.

Centre-devised assessments should be scrutinised by the Internal Moderator before use to ensure that they are fit for purpose. Centre-devised assessments will be scrutinised by the External Moderator to ensure reliability and validity of assessment.

Marking assessment activities

Each activity must be marked against the identified assessment criteria in the unit and judged to be either achieved or not achieved.

Tutor/assessors need to ensure that the work in a learner's portfolio is:

- authentic it is the result of the learner's own performance or activity;
- sufficient enabling the tutor/assessor to make a consistent and reliable judgement;
- adequate appropriate to the level.

Where a series of activities are set, learners must demonstrate the achievement of the required standard identified in the assessment criteria in all activities. All the assessment criteria in a unit must be met before the unit is deemed achieved.

The unit achievement is not graded. Units are either achieved or not achieved.

Standardisation

Standardisation is a process that promotes consistency in the understanding and application of standards in relation to assessment. It:

- compares assessment judgements from different tutor/assessors;
- promotes consistent judgements by different tutor/assessors;
- identifies good practice in assessment;
- promotes the sharing of good practice in assessment between Centre staff.

Standardisation events should be held periodically within Centres to ensure consistent and effective assessment practice. Standardisation events may also be held by OCN London and it is a requirement that each Centre offering units from the qualification must contribute assessment materials and learners' evidence for standardisation, if requested.

OCN London will notify Centres of the required sample for standardisation purposes and assessment materials, learners' evidence and tutor/assessor feedback may be collected by External Moderators.

Learners with particular requirements

If learners have particular requirements the Centre should refer to the Access to Fair Assessment Policy and Procedure which gives clear guidance on the reasonable adjustments and arrangements that can be made to take account of disability or learning difficulty, without compromising the achievement of the assessment criteria.

Requirements for tutor/assessors

To be sufficiently competent

In addition to being qualified to make assessment decisions, each tutor/assessor must be capable of carrying out the full requirements within the competency of the units they are assessing. This competence should be maintained annually through clearly demonstrable continuing learning and professional development.

Expert witnesses can be used where they have suitable expertise for specialist areas. The use of expert witnesses should be determined and agreed by the tutor/assessor.

To be sufficiently knowledgeable

Each tutor/assessor should possess relevant knowledge and understanding of the subject and so be able to make robust and reliable assessment decisions in relation to the subject.
