ACCESS TO HE DIPLOMA (ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE) Qualification Aim Number: Credit Value: 60 40013133 **OVERVIEW** As a learner on this qualification you will be offered a coherent, integrated and supported year of study through which you will gain the knowledge, awareness, skills and confidence necessary for successful undergraduate study in a range of environmental science related progression routes. The qualification aims: to provide HE progression opportunities for adults who, because of social, educational or individual circumstances, do not have the necessary qualifications; to give learners a general introduction to the basic concepts, methods, and key areas of knowledge within the core disciplines What will you learn taken and offer a coherent and stimulating framework within which and achieve by doing they can broaden their intellectual outlook and make connections this qualification? between subject areas; to help learners to develop and consolidate the various skills required to enable them to cope successfully with the demands of undergraduate study and to become independent, self-directed learners; to establish a positive and supportive learning environment within which learners can build their confidence through successful learning and the sharing of their experience. If you successfully complete the qualification you will achieve a QAA recognised Access to HE Diploma. Although there are no formal entry requirements, some colleges may ask you to have GCSE Maths and or English at grade A* to C. In some cases, you may be able to study one of these GCSEs alongside the Access to HE Diploma. The college may ask you to sit an English and, in some cases, a **Entry requirements** maths diagnostic test. You may be asked for an interview as part of the application process. There are no age restrictions, although most colleges would expect you to be Age restrictions 19 or over. Fees may vary between colleges. If you are 19 or over, you may be eligible for a Advanced Learning Loan. The loan you take out for your Access to HE Fees Diploma will be written off once you have completed a Higher Education





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	course. You can apply through your college or directly to the Student Loans Company. If you are between 19 and 23, you may be eligible for some funding if this is your first full level 3 qualification. Please check with your college.
Is this the right qualification for you?	 The Access to Higher Education Diploma (Environmental Science) is a qualification which prepares people without traditional qualifications for study at university. It is designed for: adults with a current or previous role or interest in an environmental science related area; adults who, because of social, educational or individual circumstances, were unable to participate in or benefit from initial education; adults from groups under-represented in higher education; adults seeking a change of direction because of unemployment or lack of career opportunities in their previous field and who have a demonstrable interest in entering an environmental science related profession.
Where can you study this Access to HE Diploma?	This qualification is delivered by OCN London centres including Further Education Colleges, and Adult and Community Education Centres. QUALIFICATION STRUCTURE

The qualification is structured so that it meets the Quality Assurance Agency for Higher Education's (QAA) Access to HE Specification requirements.

All Access to HE Diplomas are made up of units of assessment that amount to 60 credits. Each credit represents 10 notional hours of learning. Most units are for either 3 or 6 credits.

How is the qualification structured?

The qualification's 60 credits include 45 graded credits at level 3 that must be achieved from units that have academic subject content. The remaining 15 credits will be from study skills units that will both provide you with the skills to study the Access course and prepare you for study at Higher Education. Most of these are at level 3 (ungraded) but some may be at level 2 depending on your course at the college.

Learners must meet the Qualification Rules of Combination which will require you to achieve all the mandatory units as well as the required credits in other modules.

The subjects available to study as part of the qualification will vary between colleges. Please check with your local college as to which subject modules





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are offered.





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PROGRESSION	
Where would you progress from this qualification?	Learners primarily progress to Higher Education study in areas related to Environmental Science. These may include some of the following areas of Degree level study: Conservation Science, Ecology, Environmental Biology, Environmental Geography, Environmental Geoscience, Environmental Science, Environmental Science, Environmental Science and Management, Geography, Geology, Global Development, Marine Biology, Wildlife Conservation, and a wide range of combined and related degrees.
