Entry requirements	There are no centrally specified formal requirements for qualifications on entry; however there is usually the expectation that you will have literacy, communication skills and numeracy at Level 2 or above. For learners wishing to progress to a Police Constable Degree Apprenticeship, Level 2 English is a pre-requisite with an expectation that Level 2 Functional Skills Maths will be attained by the end of the first year of the degree apprenticeship. Learners should be aware that degrees undertaken via a specific force will be subject to a successful application, vetting and offer.

Fees	Fees may vary between colleges. If you are 19 or over, you may be eligible for an Advanced Learning Loan. The loan you take out for your Access to HE Diploma will be written off once you have completed a Higher Education course. You can apply through your college or directly to the Student Loans Company. If you are between 19 and 23, you may be eligible for some funding if this is your first full level 3 qualification. Please check with your college. Please note, the Access to HE Diploma loan waiver for their adult learner loan is not available for the Police Constable Degree Apprenticeship However, learners would be salaried and would not be eligible for any HE fees.	
Is this the right qualification for you?	The Access to Higher Education Diploma (Policing) is a qualification which prepares people without traditional qualifications for study at university. It has been designed in collaboration with the Metropolitan Police Service and has been mapped to the College of Policing's National Programme Specification for External Programmes. It is designed for: adults with an interest in joining the police force; adults who, because of social, educational or individual circumstances, were unable to participate in or benefit from initial education; adults from groups under-represented in higher education; adults seeking a change of direction because of unemployment or lack of career opportunities in their previous field and who have a

QUALIFICATION STRUCTURE				
	The qualification is structured so that it meets the Quality Assurance Agency for Higher Education's (QAA) Access to HE Specification requirements.			
How is the qualification structured?	All Access to HE Diplomas are made up of units of assessment that amount to 60 credits. Each credit represents 10 notional hours of learning. Most units are for either 3 or 6 credits.			
	The qualification's 60 credits include 45 graded credits at level 3 that must be achieved from units that have academic subject content. The remaining 15 credits will be from study skills units that will both provide you with the

skills to study the Access course and prepare you for study at Higher Education. Most of these are at level 3 (ungraded) but some may be at level 2 depending on your course at the college.

Learners must meet the Qualification Rules of Combination which will require you to achieve all the mandatory units as well as the required credits in other modules.

The subjects available to study as part of the qualification will vary between colleges. Please check with your local college as to which subject modules are offered.
