Qualification Overview

The **OCNLR Level 3 Certificate in Canine Hydrotherapy qualification** is aimed at helping people to become canine hydrotherapists and to gain the necessary skills to ensure high standards of care. The qualification focuses on both hydrotherapy theory and the practical application of skills and knowledge.

Learners will benefit by gaining an insight into how they might ethically and responsibly treat animals with hydrotherapy.

The **OCNLR Level 3 Certificate in Canine Hydrotherapy** qualification is regulated by Ofqual, the qualifications regulator for England, and are registered on the Regulated Qualifications Framework (RQF). It is not a licence to practise.

Qualification details

This Qualification is available at this level only. (There is also an Award and a Diploma at Level 4, and an Award for Canine Hydrotherapy Assistants at Level 2. See separate Qualification Guides for these related qualifications.)

Purpose of the qualification

The purpose of the **OCNLR Level 3 Certificate in Canine Hydrotherapy** qualification is to help learners gain the knowledge and skills required to obtain employment in the canine hydrotherapy sector. Skills learnt may aid their continued study, for example in higher education, and / or help with employment related skills, whether in a related vocation or more generally.

This qualification has been developed in partnership with *Greyfriars Veterinary Rehabilitation and Hydrotherapy Referrals*.

Who the qualification is for

The **OCNLR Level 3 Certificate in Canine Hydrotherapy** qualification is suitable for adults who want to work in the canine hydrotherapy sector.

Entry guidance

The minimum age for access to the qualification is 18 years.

Learners must have competent language skills in both spoken and written English.

Educational pre-requisites

This qualification is suitable for learners who have completed the OCNLR Level 2 Award for Canine Hydrotherapy Assistants and/or are equipped for study at level 3.

Progression and related qualifications

The **OCNLR Level 3 Certificate in Canine Hydrotherapy** will provide learners with the skills and knowledge required to work as canine hydrotherapists. This qualification is a pre-requisite for the OCNLR Level 4 Award and Diploma in Canine Hydrotherapy and is a gateway to higher level qualifications in this subject.

Requirements for delivering this qualification

Please refer to the sections on [tutor/assessor requirements for specific units](#) and [facility requirements](#) before applying to deliver this qualification. It should be noted that Centres delivering this qualification need to ensure learners have access to the facilities and equipment needed for them to carry out, and provide evidence of, 20 hours of practical canine hydrotherapy and water treadmill treatment.

Structure of the qualification

Rules of combination for achievement

The **OCNLR Level 3 Certificate in Canine Hydrotherapy qualification** comprises nine mandatory units. Learners must achieve 30 credits in total, i.e. all the units.

Assessment and Moderation

Assessment process

The assessment process for this qualification is as follows:

- The learners are assessed through activities that are internally set by tutor assessors;
- The activities must be designed to enable learners to meet the assessment criteria of the unit;
- Learners' portfolios of assessed evidence must be internally moderated at the Centre;
- The portfolios of assessed evidence will be externally moderated by an OCN London External Moderator.

There is no additional external assessment for this qualification.

Devising assessments

Each unit has a supplementary page with information on the types of assessment activities that can (indicated as 'Optional' or 'O') and/or must (indicated as 'Prescribed' or 'P') be used to assess learners against the unit. Tutor assessors must always refer to this page before devising assessment tasks.

OCN London assessment guidance relevant to the units in this qualification is in the '[OCNLR Assessment Guidance and Ofqual Level Descriptors](#)' section of this qualification guide. The guidance includes a general description of the activity and the type of evidence that is appropriate. The activity or activities set must enable the learners to meet the standards detailed in the assessment criteria. Please contact OCN London for further guidance on devising appropriate assessments.

Centre devised assessments should be scrutinised by the Internal Moderator before use to ensure that they are fit for purpose. Centre devised assessments will be scrutinised by the External Moderator to ensure reliability and validity of assessment.

Marking assessment activities

Each activity must be marked against the identified assessment criteria in the unit and judged to be either achieved or not achieved.

Assessors need to ensure that the work in a learner's portfolio is:

- Authentic – it is the result of the learner's own performance or activity;
- Sufficient – enabling the assessor to make a consistent and reliable judgement;
- Adequate – appropriate to the level.

Where a series of activities are set, learners must demonstrate the achievement of the required standard identified in the assessment criteria in all activities. All of the assessment criteria in a unit must be met before the unit is deemed achieved.

The unit achievement is not graded. Units are either achieved or not achieved.

Standardisation

Standardisation is a process that promotes consistency in the understanding and application of standards in relation to assessment. It:

- compares assessment judgements from different tutor/assessors;
- promotes consistent judgements by different tutor/assessors;
- identifies good practice in assessment;
- promotes the sharing of good practice in assessment between centre staff.

Standardisation events should be held periodically within centres to ensure consistent and effective assessment practice. Standardisation events may also be held by OCN London and it is a requirement that each Centre offering units from this qualification must contribute assessment materials and learners' evidence for standardisation, if requested.

OCN London will notify Centres of the required sample for standardisation purposes and assessment materials, learners' evidence and tutor feedback may be collected by External Moderators.

Learners with particular requirements

If learners have particular requirements the Centre should refer to the 'Access to Fair Assessment Policy and Procedure' which can be found on our website at: [Access to Fair Assessment Policy and Procedure](#) and gives clear guidance on the reasonable adjustments and arrangements that can be made to take account of disability or learning difficulty, without compromising the achievement of the assessment criteria.

Requirements for tutor/assessors and internal moderators

To be sufficiently competent

In addition to being qualified to make assessment decisions, each assessor must be capable of carrying out the full requirements within the competency of the units they are assessing. This competence should be maintained annually through clearly demonstrable continuing learning and professional development.

Expert witnesses can be used where they have suitable expertise for specialist areas. The use of expert witnesses should be determined and agreed by the assessor.

To be sufficiently knowledgeable

Each tutor/assessor should possess relevant knowledge and understanding of the subject and so be able to make robust and reliable assessment decisions in relation to the subject.

Requirements for tutor/assessors to deliver specific units and facility requirements
Requirements for tutor/assessors to deliver specific units, and facility requirements are set out in the following sections (see [Table 1](#) and [Table 2](#) below).

Requirements for internal moderators

Internal moderators must hold an internal quality assurance qualification and one qualification from Group B or C in [Table 2](#).

Tutor/assessor requirements for specific units

Tutors/assessors must be qualified and experienced as indicated in Table 1 below in order to be eligible to teach/assess the specific units identified. Qualifications in the groups referred to are listed in [Table 2](#), over the page.

Facility requirements

In addition to having the appropriately qualified trained tutor/assessors, Centres offering this qualification must have the following facilities:

- a hydrotherapy pool that is large enough to allow students to be in the pool with trainer(s) and dog(s);
- the hydrotherapy pool should have safe access for both learners and dogs and be able to accommodate a wide range of patients, including small and large breeds;
- water treadmill – the design/model must allow students to enter the water treadmill and safely gain practical 'hands on' experience with a wide range of patients, including small and large breeds;
- a client base that enables the centre to provide practical training for students, giving experience of a wide range of patients/breeds/conditions;
- classroom facilities or access to classroom facilities.

It should be noted that Centres delivering this qualification need to ensure learners have access to the facilities and equipment needed for them to carry out, and provide evidence of, 20 hours of practical canine hydrotherapy and water treadmill treatment.

Please also note that all Centres applying to deliver this qualification will have to provide evidence that the facility requirements are met, which may include a centre approval visit.
