It is hard to believe that we have been back living in Wexford for a year. We are well-settled after reacquainting with friends and family during the year. Josh is back in school in 5th year and has started the Leaving Cert programme. Thankfully he is much more comfortable in school now and has made friends, and although he still misses his friends in Northern Ireland, I believe we can say he is happy.



The last few months have been a whirlwind of activity, with renovations in the church building finished in time for the Fleadh Ceoil, which was held in Wexford during the month of August. During that week over 800,000 people passed through the town of Wexford, with our Church building used by the Food Network to display their products to the public. It also involved David meeting with some Council members and having conversations with different people about our building and the history of it in the town.

WORSHIP SERVICES

We are so happy to say we had our first public service of worship on the 1st Sunday of September it was well attended and such an encouragement to us, people stayed for tea/coffee afterwards and fellowship with each other.



There were some new faces but also some of the old congregation, who were so happy and encouraged to be back in the building worshipping again. The local radio services still continue occasionally and the home group is once again meeting every Thursday evening.

COMING MONTHS

We have many plans for the next few months with a Harvest Service on 12th October and a joint prayer and worship service in November with other churches in the town. In December we plan to have a community carol service, along with our Sunday Services as well.

Outreach and opportunities will continue to be of high priority, looking for ways to bring people together.

As we look forward to the next few months, your prayers are so important to us.
