
This is a Set Dance in hornpipe time with an 8 bar first part and 14 bar second part. This dance was passed on by Charlie Keane, to Dan and James. It is one of our most popular set dances, and both the dance and music have the same name. Normally they would dance a step, a set and a finishing step, but on occasion they would dance a second set, and step. The second set is a combination of the first six bars of the first set, followed by the eight bars of the first step. The finishing step written down here is only danced on the right foot, but there are other finishing steps which are repeated on the left.

A comfortable dancing tempo would be in the region of 47 bars per minute.





