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MICHAEL TUBRIDY is a civil engineer by profession, and a musician by inclination.

He is a flute player and concertina player, and has had an illustrious career in the world of Irish music and Irish dance.

He has played with several of the most celebrated groups in the history of Irish music – the Castle Céilí Band, Ceoltóirí Chualann, and The Chieftains.

In the world of Irish dance he was a member of Connie Ryan's Slievenamon Set-dancers, and travelled with them to teach and perform in many parts of the world.

In the 1980s, along with his wife Céline, he developed an interest in the art of Irish solo step-dancing, and collected versions of these dances from the rapidly diminishing number of tradition-bearers who still carried them – Dan Furey and James Keane of Labasheeda, among others.

In 2013 he was awarded the TG4 Gradam Ceoil award for Lifetime Achievement.





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
