

Shelter Cluster Coordination Meeting

Typhoon Mangkhut / Ompong (September 2018)

Typhoon Yutu / Rosita (October 2018)

Wednesday 7th November 2018, 10:00 am

This was the fifth Shelter Cluster coordination meeting to: (i) report on Typhoon Yutu (Rosita) impact and emerging shelter needs – through the ICCG Impact and needs Desk Review initiative in coordination and cooperation with SC partners – and to (ii) agree on cluster target capacity and operational priorities to revise the HCT Humanitarian Response and Resources Overview's (HRRO) strategic rationale and the Shelter Cluster Operational Response Plan (ORP) aggregating humanitarian needs, from impact of both disasters, in a single response (it was therefore agreed that the Cluster position for revision of the HRRO SC ORP would feed into the ongoing update the Shelter Cluster strategic framework), and for (iii) attending agencies to provide operational updates on their ongoing and planned activities and 3W reporting flow and challenges (3W Report of Typhoon Mangkhut Response, 30 October 2018, OCHA).

3. Impact of Typhoon Yutu (Rosita)

On 30 October typhoon Yutu (Rosita) made landfall in Dinapigue, Isabela province, adding a new caseload of vulnerable families with damaged houses in need of immediate emergency shelter assistance and further shelter recovery assistance.

Inter Cluster Coordination Group (ICCG) impact and needs Desk Review initiative:

The Shelter Cluster Coordinator engaged with the ICCG and UN OCHA, to prepare for contingent humanitarian response from impact of Typhoon Yutu, prepare dedicated sectoral rapid-assessment tool and mobilising SC partners with field presence to contribute (direct observation and key informant assessment) to the inter-sectoral desk review of the typhoon immediate impact and emerging humanitarian needs.

The ICCG has agreed to revision of the Humanitarian Response ResoO Shelter Cluster ORP:

Considering that consecutive disasters have resulted in incremental hose damage in northern Luzon one response

- (i) Collapsed or partially collapsed timber framed houses, usually lacking the critical structural components, require an absolute minimum of PHP 50,000.
- (ii) Highly damaged houses built of mixed structural materials (typically half height masonry walls with timber upper walls and timber roofs), require a minimum of PHP 35,000.
- (iii) Structural concrete and confined masonry houses with damaged roofs, require a minimum of PHP 21,000.

Considering the ongoing process to update the Shelter Cluster strategic framework to reflect a shift in shelter needs and resulting adjustment in the way agencies are responding aor planning to respond

coordination with the ICCG, the Shelter cluster partners have agreed to consider a combined response to the impact of both disasters, to be preliminary materialised in a revision of the HRRO Shelter Cluster ORP, including adjusting the response strategical approach and required additional funding for implementation within a 6-month period.

As of 10 November, it was reported than an additional 78,000 families or 300,000 have been affected, across Regions I, II, III, VIII and Cordilleras Autonomous Region (CAR), with more than 2,500 houses totally damaged and over 22,500 houses partially damaged.

- No displacement after the TY according to IOM DTM – some cases in CAR as previous event. Everyone who evacuated is taken care of and returned to their villages by now.
- Damage figures are increasing significantly > Southern Isabela is the most affected area and some concentration of destroyed houses in Itogon, CAR

Yutu = 2,323 totally damaged = 19, 055 partially damaged =

Ompong = 24,827 + 294,357 = **319,184 damaged houses**

Tot = **340,562 houses damaged** by both TY (DROMIC) – Regions I,II, III, CAR , VIII

Destroyed house assistance = 550 USD/HH

Heavily damaged house = 200 USD/HH

TA = 7 USD/HH

EIC = 2 USD/HH
