<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sussundenga, severely affected, particularly in Dombe area. • Mossurize, affected but with no resettlement sites. • Gondola, is the least affected. • Macate, has two resettlement sites – not formalised 		
2. Update on GPRR (Provincial Group for Recovery and Resettlement)		
<p>Monday's meeting was in essence a strategical meeting, with Secretaria Permanente and four/five directors from provincial departments – agriculture, public works, energy, land etc. – to understand the different roles. Secretaria Permanente took the Terms of Reference (ToR) draft by OCHA, to discuss internally and flagged a potential meeting for next Monday (17/06) to give an update. The official ToR will still have to come from the government.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • WFP will act as coordination agency (instead of OCHA), Domingos Cunha being the representative of the humanitarian partners. • UNICEF has requested to be mentioned in the ToR as the partner that will provide WASH, Education, Protection and Health in the resettlement areas. • IOM responsible for the resettlement plan in these camps. However, it seems like a full assessment of the resettlement camps has not been completed and data is still missing on what already exists, what has been done in terms of WASH, Shelter etc. IOM to meet with DPTADER and start with re-demarcation, prioritising the camps where people have already been moved to. Still no definition in regards to where they will start.

<i>On HLP</i>		
Save the Children informs that in Matarara, through surveys they performed people say that the land is theirs, that the government has given it to them. Community leaders confirm that INGC went there and gave them a 30x40 plot for every two families. People in the community are convinced that the government will give them land, CGI, cement, doors and windows; and they will do the rest. For Save the Children, their perception is that this is how the government has operated in this area before, therefore people's discourse across these communities is similar. For Save the Children, the problem is that the land is not safe. The rebuilding areas were flooded; this is the case in Matarara. People say that INGC in collaboration with the community leaders gave them the plots. IOM say they have not done the assessment yet, but will do and they will draft some recommendations for the government to reassess the plots. According to IOM/CCCM, the Director of DPTADER mentioned in Monday's meeting that they would review the resettlement areas.	IOM/CCCM will follow-up. <p>Save the Children started doing a very preliminary market assessment in Dombe, Sussundenga and Chimoio on cement, CGI and wood:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cement available in Dombe area and the cost is similar to Chimoio. Chimoio 450 MZN and in Dombe 480 MZN. • CGI in Dombe area were not up to standard, very thin and bad quality. This material will likely have to be sourced from Chimoio. • In terms of wood, the community said they usually buy it in Matarara. <p>They are looking at providing the materials, plus the training of carpenters and technical support from the team. If they are able to do more than 200HH, they will try to reach more but this will depend on their assessment of needs of the community. Through their assessment, there is also the understanding that people prefer to have the materials, instead of cash or vouchers.</p>		Save the Children

<p>Save the Children has identified a community called Mechisso that is not part of any list. According to them, in the initial WASH list it was a community with no access. However, in current maps the community is still not listed. It is a community of around 342 families and Save the Children gave tarpaulins to 250 families about a month ago.</p> <p><i>SC Roaming Coordinator went to Dombe on Friday and talked with the head of Matarara locality, who confirmed that Mechisso was not on any list and did not receive official support. Chaambuca, a community located after Matarara, was also flagged as not being part of any list and not receiving support.</i></p>	<p>Follow-up with government; share with DTM so that it can be tracked.</p> <p>Share with Shelter Cluster partners during Shelter Cluster meeting in Beira.</p>	Shelter Cluster and IOM/CCCM
<p>All partners agree that there is a need to raise awareness regarding Manica, particularly the shelter needs.</p> <p><i>At later meeting between the SC Roaming Coordinator and Manica WASH Cluster Coordinator, it was mentioned that during the last WASH meeting a lot of the focus was on Shelter needs, because the partners have stated that many of the communities that they are providing WASH assistance have not received Shelter. WASH partners might be keen to distribute Shelter kits and materials in areas they are working in. DCA, GVC and DORCAS are working in these areas with big shelter needs covering around 1500 families, and have already flagged they are willing to do shelter distribution. Ideally they would be supported by Shelter partners in Manica for technical guidance.</i></p>	<p>Disseminate this information among partners</p> <p>Flag this during Shelter Cluster meeting in Beira and link these partners with IOM and others for the items they have for distribution.</p>	Shelter Cluster team and partners

<p>The Shelter Recovery strategy has been approved and shared with partners by email. Although it will still have some changes, it can be used by Shelter partners as a basepoint for defining their recovery activities.</p>	Re-share with meeting minutes	Shelter Cluster team and partners
<p>There needs to be more clarification on land titles and security of tenure, which, as mentioned during the meeting, is quite important for partners to approach donors. DPOPHRH (province) say they do not have clear information regarding land titles being given to people in the resettlement camps. The District is the one distributing the plots, so they can give the information or MITADER. The District is the one passing the DUAT. According to UNICEF and IOM/CCCM this issue has not been raised during Monday's meeting.</p>	Follow-up with government	Shelter Cluster
