Response update

- 135.017 persons assisted by the Shelter and NFI cluster partners since 25 February
 - 72.911 assisted people with NFI kits in collective centers
 - 44.548 assisted people with NFI kits at the household level
 - 17.408 assisted people with shelter kits
 - 2 buildings reported refurbished (150 sleeping places in total)

Approx. 48,6K assisted people last week (last week 30K/week approx.)

2. Partners update

IOM is also in Vinnytsia, Ivano Frankiv, Chernivtsi, in the east we are supporting through Ips Poltava, Zaporizhzhia, Novovolynsk, Dnipro

Samaritan's Purse in Vinnytsia

UNHCR: Considering the possibility to support the return of the communities to liberated areas providing temporarily accommodation in the areas of origin until the reconstruction is finished.

UNDP: “debris removal” activity in this context is going to be more challenging, it’ll need to be combined with demining activity – a lot of unexploded remnants of war are in place along with shelter debris. Also other dangerous construction materials such as asbestos requires specific treatment and PPE for the workers. Planning debris removal first of the roads to important services for the communities and in a second stage the residential areas as such.

Humanitarian Assistance, Ukrainian Education Platform: the organization is going to rehabilitate a building of a local school in Lviv oblast. They also have around 300 volunteers in the country, and they are exploring opportunities to expand activities. Strong connection with municipalities and considering the support of small municipalities with small scale temporarily housing intervention (less than 500 p) in places where access to social services and to employment is guaranteed by the municipalities.
