

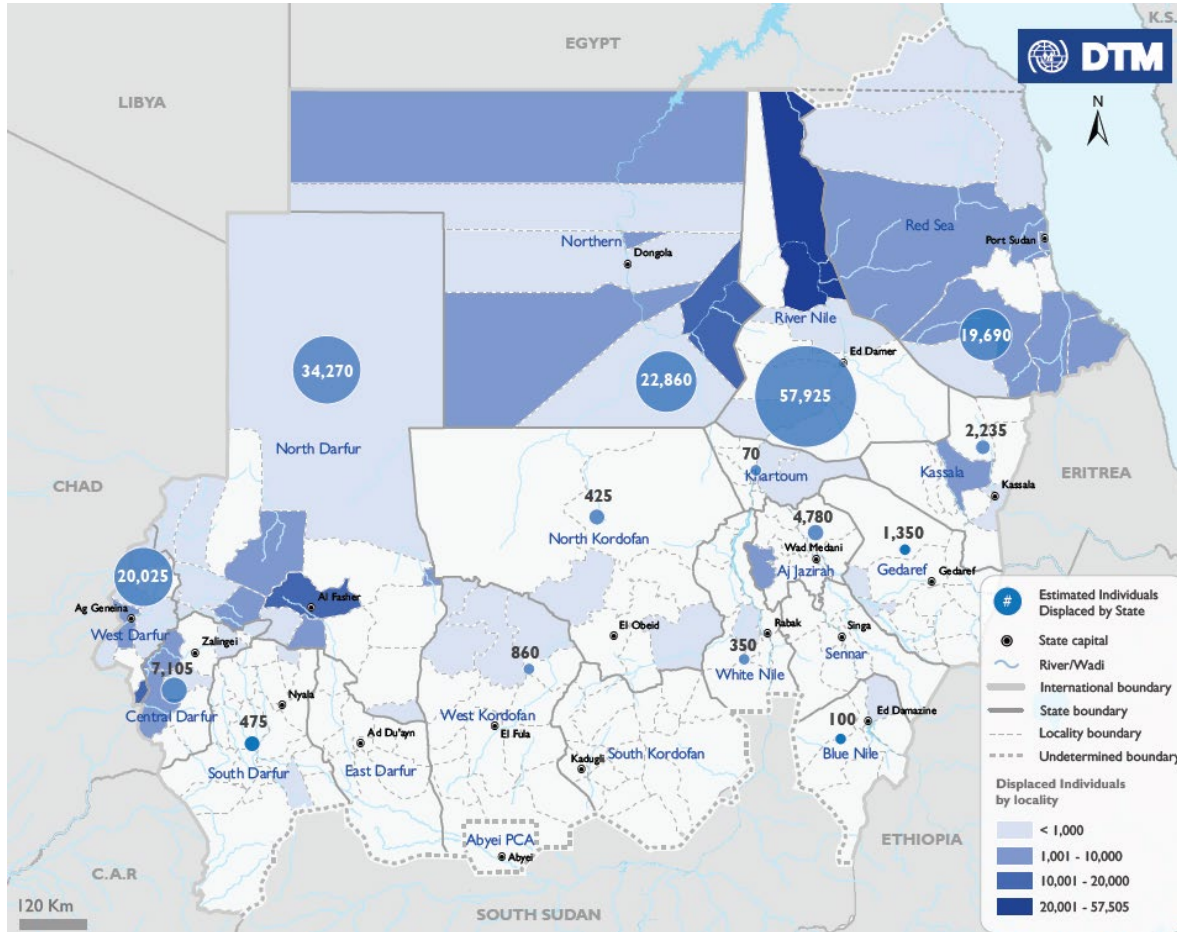

SITUATION UPDATE



- According to DTM, **10.8M** Sudanese have been displaced across Sudan's **18** States in **8,842** locations.
- **2.3M** have crossed borders to seek refuge.
- To date **173K** have been displaced due to floods in **15** States and **57** locations.
- **31K** houses have been destroyed and **32K** were partially damaged
- Over the past 2 weeks Gedaref (69K), Blue Nile (23K), River Nile (19K), Northern (15K) and West Darfur (12K) have received more increase in IDPs
- Sennar (79K), Aj Jazirah (9K), White Nile (7K) have recorded a decrease in the number of IDPs.

Issues/Challenges

- Volatile security situation, airstrikes by SAF in Darfur region and shelling on
- El Fasher in N Darfur, El Obeid in North Kordofan and Dilling in South Kordofan under siege and constant shelling, resulting Humanitarian situation and affecting SNFI planning and response.
- Ongoing heavy rains and flooding are expected to continue impeding the movement of humanitarian personnel and SNFI stocks, further exacerbating the situation for those affected.
- Unavailability of essential supplies and NFIs and the limited capacity of cluster partners due to limited access pose significant challenges to delivery efforts.
- The existing stock levels are minimal compared to the growing needs, including flooding and conflict-induced displacement.
- As the S/NFI cluster lead, UNHCR continues to reach out to agencies to support the NFI response.

Business Continuity Challenges

- Mobile network connectivity remains challenging, impacting partner activities and limiting access to cluster partner
- Communication infrastructure damaged due rains and floods such as the collapse of roads around the Krinding and Mornei bridges due to August floods is delaying the supply of stocks.
- Crossline movements from Port Sudan to Darfur were suspended due to the impassable roads; e.g delays the arrival of 8,500 plastic sheeting and 1,270 NFI kits
- UNHCR 4 trucks with NFI kits stuck in Mellit since July due to access issues between RSF and SAF controlled area and are at risk.

Red Sea State

Arbaa't:

- **73 villages** were affected by flood including **7000 affected people** just living along the street and in the mountain areas or high places.
- **3 community centers were established** namely Tukli, Gap Deep and Albab for possible distribution and upcoming humanitarian support to the affected populations.
- An inter-agency assessment visit was conducted to Arbaat , they managed to cover **28 villages**.

Towkar and Ageeg ;

- Still inaccessible but OCHA requested the clusters to be prepared and ready for any quick notification and reaction (only you can reach ziro kilo
- An inter-agency assessment **visit is planned tomorrow**.

Following the situation **an ad-hoc S/NFI meetings were conducted** and agreed on intervention to Arbaa't area.



Shelter and NFI Needs

- Most of the villages were completely affected and washed down by the floods, and as a result, many families may have lost their homes and belongings and require temporary shelter.
- With standing water, the risk of mosquito-borne diseases such as malaria, making mosquito nets essential for protection.
- All affected villages lack electricity networks; thus, the distribution of solar lamps is essential.



Recommendations

- Distribution of temporary shelters (tents) and Core Relief Items (CRI) to the affected population.
- Distribution of clothing and personal items.
- Distribution of Solar lanterns or flashlights is essential for safety and security in areas without electricity.
- Involve the community in the distribution process to ensure that items meet their needs and reach the targeted population.
- Communities reported gaps related to identifying households or vulnerable individuals who may have been missed in the initial population listing, thus a rapid assessment and token distribution is essential before the Shelter and CRI distribution. Community representatives emphasized in-kind distribution.
- Many families have left the area for Port Sudan town where they have relatives. Thus, clear messages to the community, key informants, and GoS representatives have to be reinforced to avoid misunderstanding, given that the items will be distributed to those registered and on the ground.

Red Sea State

Partners Interventions so far:


- ADD: Distribution of 500 NFI kits in Arbaat area.
- Qatar Charity : distribution of 50 tents .
- IOM distribution of 500 tents.
- SP : Has NFIs in the pipeline and under processing.
- UNHCR: is planning to distribute CRI.
- DCD , will distribute 1000 NFI kits.



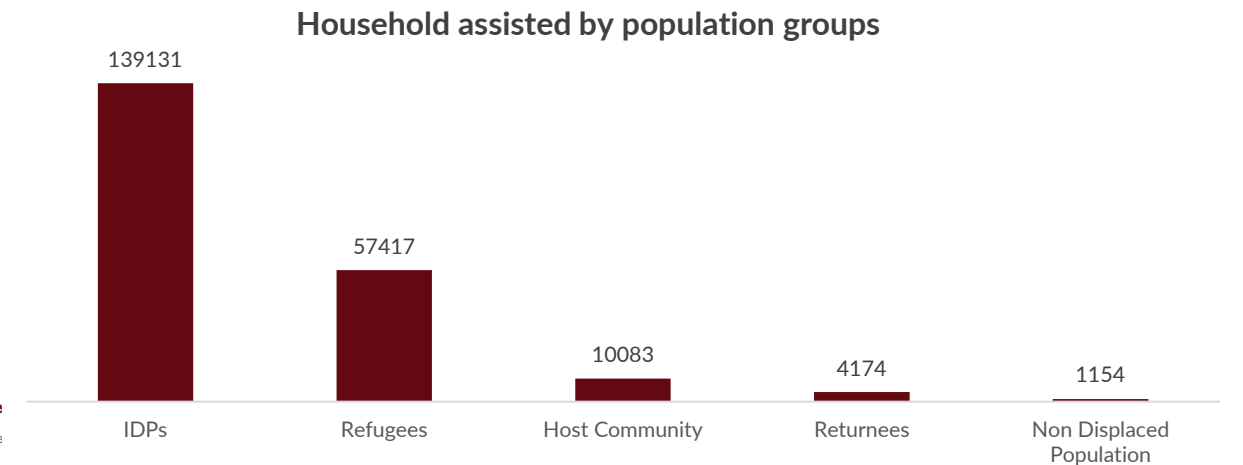
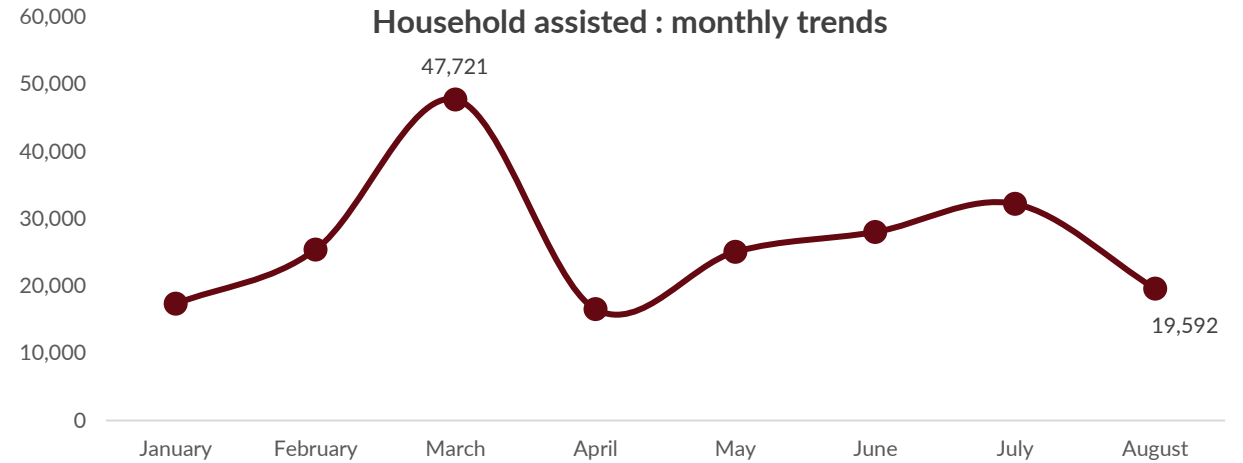
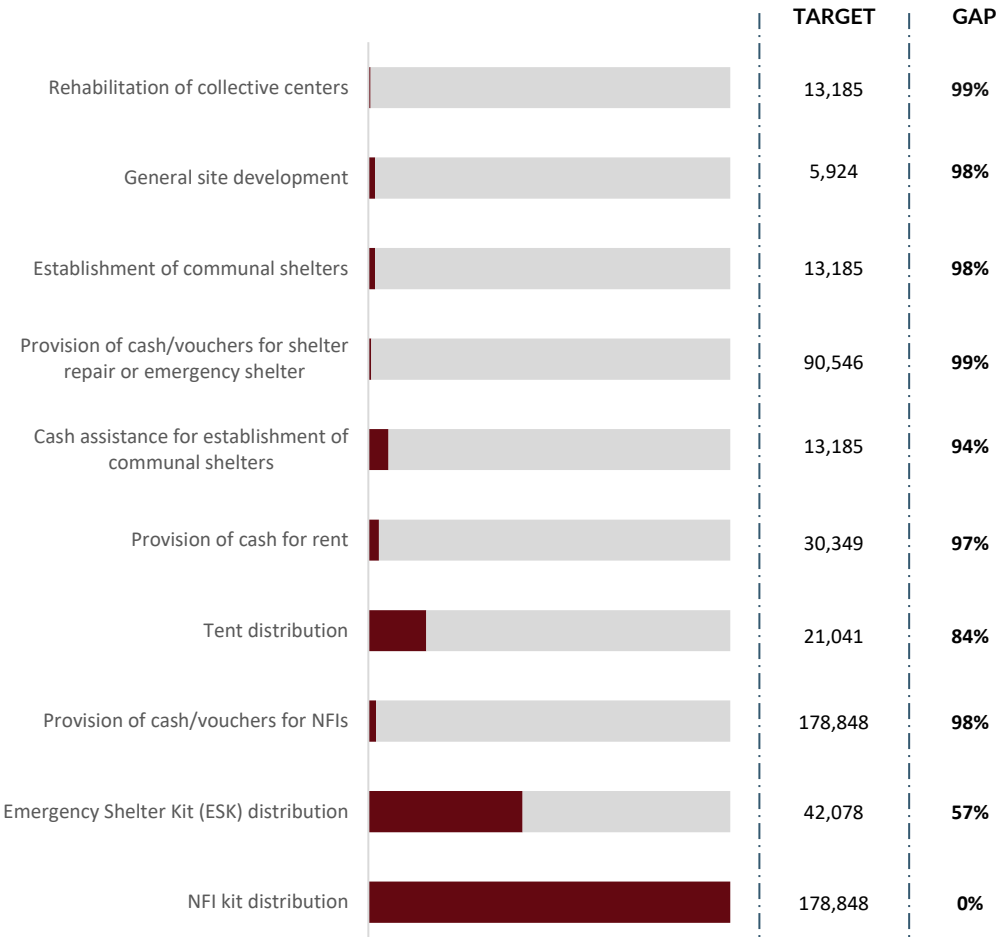

Shelter and NFI Cluster Response Progress – August 2024

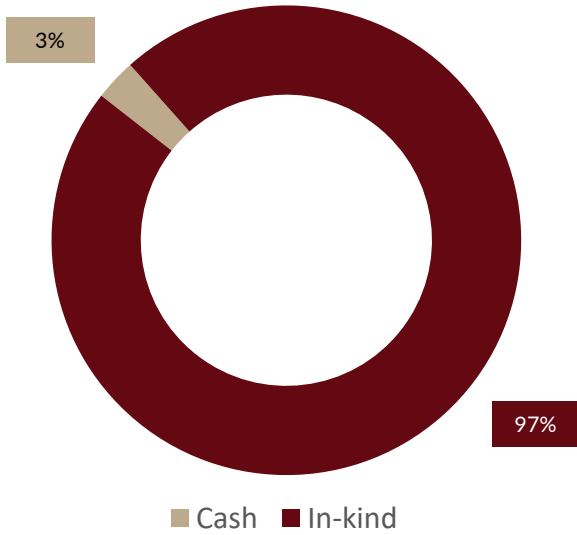

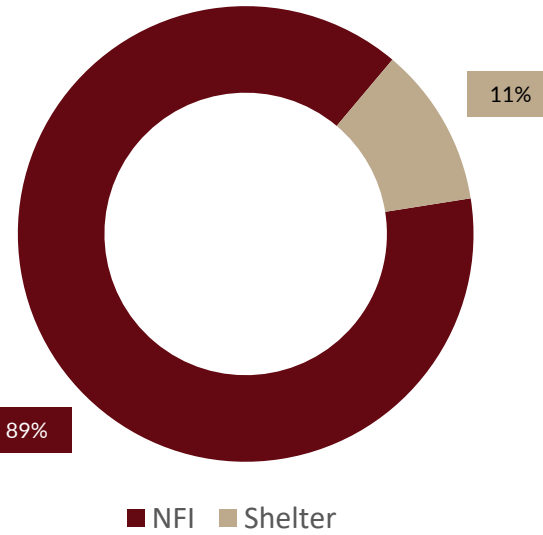


Shelter and NFI Cluster Response Progress – August 2024

Assistance modality



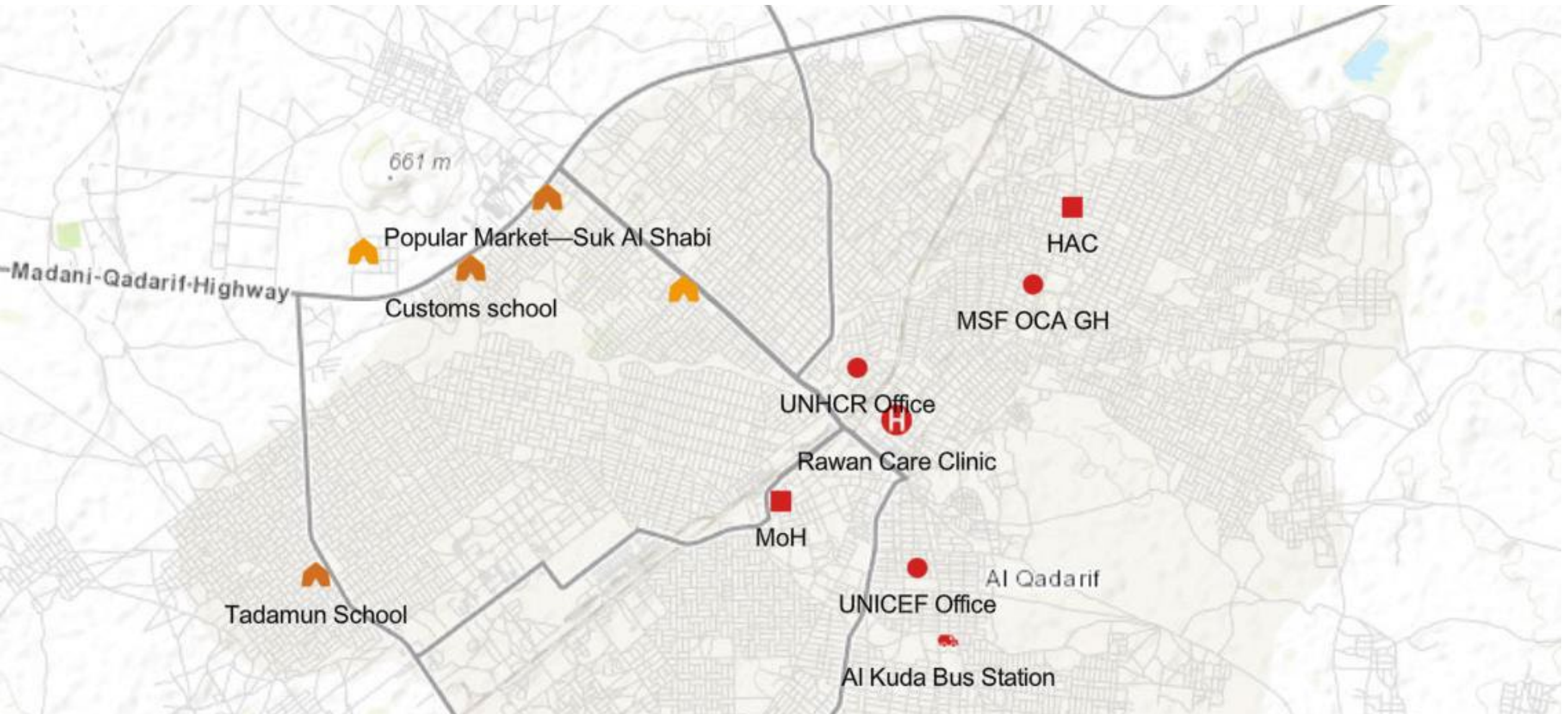

ROUNDTABLE ON ACHIEVEMENTS AND OPERATIONAL PLANS

- **Objective:** Ensure that our collective response efforts are well communicated to partners, donors, media and general audiences!
- **Achievements** – type of interventions, HH reached, locations, timeframe, etc.
- **Challenges** – looting of supplies, access challenges, etc.
- **Procurement** – quantities of stocks arriving to the country, type of stocks, timeframe, where will the stocks be prepositioned – particularly given the incoming flood season.
- **Assessments** – e.g., needs assessments outlining specifics with respect to Shelter and NFI needs as well as market assessments on NFIs, shelter materials, or Cash for Rent.
- **Context and impact** of interventions – e.g., any successes with respect to cash for rent, how is sustainability achieved, what about tenure security?
- **Interventions in the host community** – with 67% of the population staying in host community – what has been achieved so far? Cash for shelter for the families hosting IDPs can be an option, or preselecting landlords to improve their housing in order for them to subsidize rent for IDPs – this can include negotiating longer-term tenure security.
