

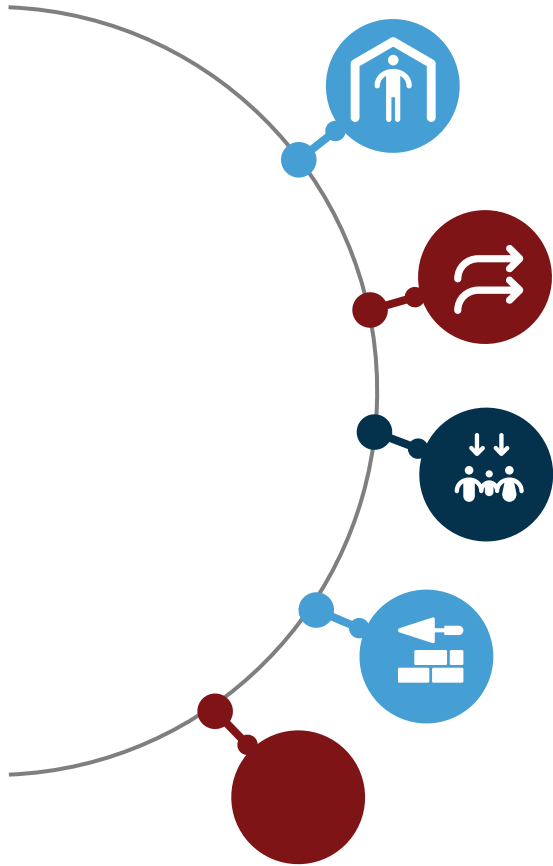

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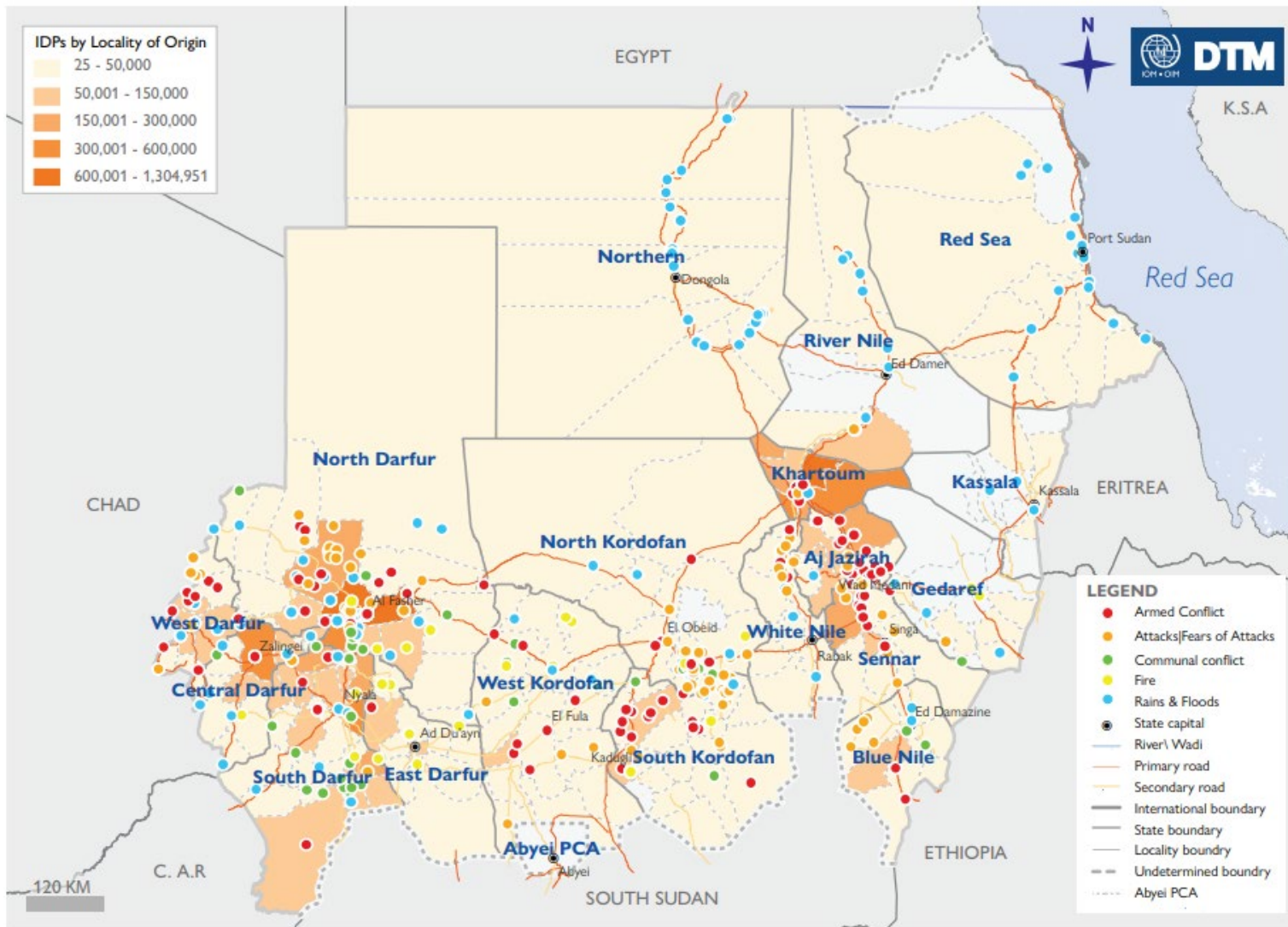


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SITUATION UPDATES



Between 01 October and 30 November 2024, DTM Sudan reported 52 incidents that triggered sudden displacement, including **armed clashes (32)**, **natural hazards (2)**, **attacks or anticipated attacks (17)**, and **inter-communal clashes (1)**.

States with the most reported incidents were **North Darfur (24)**, **West Darfur (7)** and **Aj Jazirah (5)** states.

Flash alerts throughout October and November 2024 primarily reflected **increased displacement** due to the escalation of clashes in Aj Jazirah, which displaced an estimated **393,337 individuals**. In addition, ongoing clashes across North Darfur continued to trigger displacement from Al Fasher town to other locations across Al Fasher, Kebkabiya, and Tawila localities in North Darfur.

SITUATION UPDATES (DARFUR & KORDOFAN)

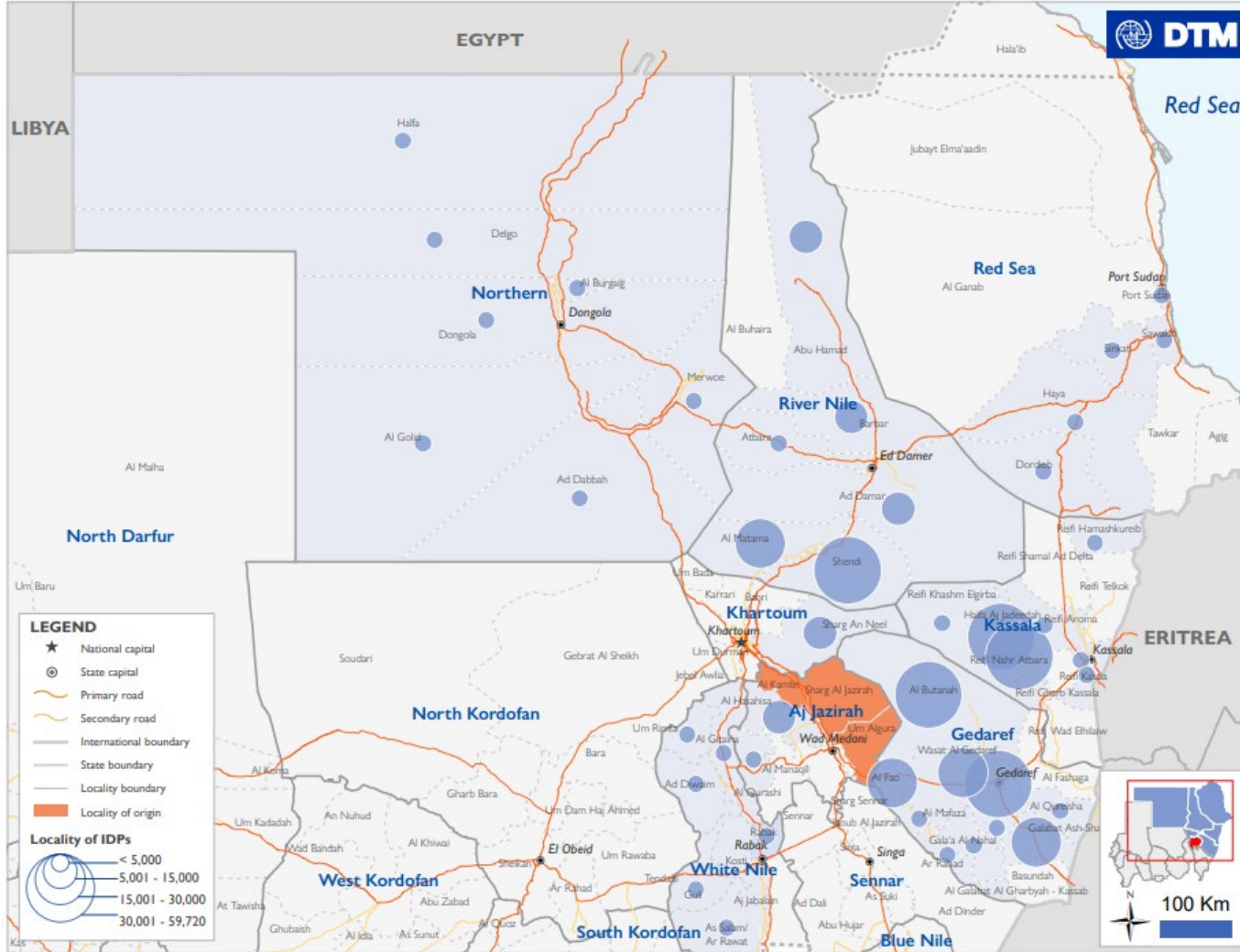
Situation:

- Deteriorating security situation in North Darfur- Elfasher under siege and 800,000 individuals at risk
- Zamzam IDP camp hseeling by RSF last week affected IDPs and Refugees-728 Families displaced
- IDP movement towards Tawila and Jabal marrah
- School eviction in Tawill 9SLA controlled areas.
- Intercommunal conflicts in regions of Darfur affecting the IDPs response

Needs:

- Resources and active partners
- Advocacy for Access particularly in North Darfur
- XL supply needs to be established from Port Sudan to Kordofan region, and from South Sudan XB.

SITUATION UPDATES (Aj Jazirah)

The reported estimate for secondary displacement is based on data collected from Sharg Aj Jazirah and Um Algura localities, as reported in Sudan Mobility Update 11. DTM field teams could not report granular data on secondary displacement from other localities due to telecommunication outages.

Between 20 October and 28 November 2024, an estimated total of **393,337 individuals (78,963 households)** were displaced from locations across Aj Jazirah state due to an escalation in clashes between the Sudanese Armed Forces (SAF) and the Rapid Support Forces (RSF).

Individuals were reportedly displaced to **46 localities** across eight different states. Among those displaced, an estimated **16,930 individuals were already displaced prior to the escalation**, and therefore experienced secondary displacement.



393,337 IDPs displaced due to clashes in Aj Jazirah since 20 October 2024.



297,400 IDPs were hosted in Aj Jazirah as of 21 November 2024.



41% of individuals displaced from Aj Jazirah since 20 October 2024 were hosted across 10 localities in Gedaref state.

SITUATION UPDATES (GEDAREF, KASSALA)

❑ **Kassala**

UNHCR support in village 6 reached 2006 HH were received NFIs kits , and 372 Tents were pitched in the side form the beginning of the east Gazira crisis in New Halfa , village 6 .

❑ IOM supported by 940 NFI kits in village 6 and 1000 NFI Kits to IDPs in Al Griba. IOM planned to distribute 3,000 ESKs in New Halfa , material already mobilized to the site. And have plan to distribute more 1,500 ESKs as part of RRF program to target IDPs New Halfa.

❑ SNFIs sub national cluster conducted the regular biweekly meeting, a task group formed to come with priority sector needs.

SITUATION UPDATES (RED SEA)

Achievements:

- Ongoing efforts by WHH, IRW, SP, ADD and UNHCR focus on NFI , family tents distributions and solar lamps, with plans for further distributions in different sectors and gathering sites from multiple partners.
- Coordination and accurate beneficiary targeting remain critical to avoid overlaps and ensure transparency.
- Adjustments to distribution plans are necessary based on household numbers and ground realities.
- Solar lamp installations require prioritization and further assessment for effective implementation.

Implemented activities:

- **WHH** Completed distribution of remaining items from 2,000 partial NFI kits and 405 family tents in the central and western sectors, with 150 tents distributed in ALHishaan.
- **IRW** distributed 800 NFI kits, 685 plastic sheets, and 750 water storage containers.
- **ADD** Activities: 800 kits are pending HAC federal decision as they were allocated for emergencies in states other than the Red Sea.
- **UNFPA** is Plans to distribute 350 family solar lamps and 80 fixed lamps as part of GBV risk mitigation measures.
- **IOM** is Processing 3,000 hygiene kits in collaboration with WHH, with distribution planned upon release.
- **UNHCR** distributed 421 full NFI kits in 5 gathering sites and 2 IDP communities (Alaman and Dar Alniem) and completed the distribution of 472 plastic sheets to reinforce tents in 3 gathering sites.

Gaps & Challenges:

- Post-distribution monitoring revealed that **100% of NFI kits** distributed by ADD were reallocated by local committees and redistributed among other families.
- Target group criteria require refinement as the estimated number of households is 1,402 (7,588 individuals).
- More NFIs and Shelter support needed for ALHishan Area IN Port Sudan.

Assessment:

S/NFI cluster participated in interagency assessment visit to ALHishan area.

RESPONSE

UPDATE PARTNERS

- **Objective:** Ensure that our collective response efforts are well communicated to partners, donors, media and general audiences!
- **Achievements** – type of interventions, HH reached, locations, timeframe, etc.
- **Challenges** – looting of supplies, access challenges, etc.
- **Procurement** – quantities of stocks arriving to the country, type of stocks, timeframe, where will the stocks be prepositioned – particularly given the incoming flood season.
- **Assessments** – e.g., needs assessments outlining specifics with respect to Shelter and NFI needs as well as market assessments on NFIs, shelter materials, or Cash for Rent.
- **Context and impact** of interventions – e.g., any successes with respect to cash for rent, how is sustainability achieved, what about tenure security?
- **Interventions in the host community** – with 67% of the population staying in host community – what has been achieved so far? Cash for shelter for the families hosting IDPs can be an option, or preselecting landlords to improve their housing in order for them to subsidize rent for IDPs – this can include negotiating longer-term tenure security.

- Concept note scoring by cluster focal points and SHF by following criteria:
 - 14 points : Programme alignment – alliance of NGOs
 - 14 points : Operational presence and cluster capacity in targeted state and localities
 - 10 points : Localization
 - 4 points : Consortium approach
 - 4 points : Cluster coordination involvement
 - 4 points : Quality of suggested project response

- Alliance of NGOs
 - Concept notes submitted by one NGO for one cluster amount in the programme will most likely not be selected
 - Concept notes covering the entire state programme will be prioritized, likely several NGOs included
 - Concept note can suggest consortium approach, or separate grants

- **Focus on:**
 - Use the capacity building budget line – for consortiums with INGO-NNGO – up to 2% of budget
 - Use available coordination budget line – up to 3% for consortiums above \$1M
 - Consult with clusters – minimum cluster package
