## 1. WASH

---

- Provision of water more separate but sanitation facilities should be integrated with shelter solutions.
- Sanitation facilities coastline completely damaged.
- Hinterland perhaps on superstructure is damaged but the sub-structure is ok.
- DSWD providing 10,000 of construction materials for partially damaged.
- 30,000 pesos of construction materials for totally destroyed.
- 4 agencies entering into reconstruction considering Sanitation activities:
  - ACF doing WASH activities in Estancia (camp only), Pilar, Ponte Vedra. Additional assessments of islands
  - WHH still at beginning of considering how to integrate WASH in shelter activities
  - Emergency Architects concentrating on schools,
  - Inland areas sanitation is a development problem. Many areas are in flooded areas where sanitation is complicated, e.g.: Sigma. Sanitation is non-existent.
  - Handicap: Modality for WASH intervention through distribution of materials
- Department of Health is relevant gov. agency concerned with sanitation for DSWD and others to coordinate with.
- Dep. Of Health promote the basin but concern some families don't have the capacity to install it
- WASH sanitation strategy is to improve the pre-typhoon sanitation coverage. Pre-typhoon sanitation level was in some places less than 30%. Priority to focus on improving emergency situation.

## 2. EDUCATION:

---

- Request from education cluster to assist teachers with shelter needs.

## 3. EARLY RECOVERY CLUSTER:

---

- Focussing on cash for work – rate is minimum salary. Min. 287 Pesos/day for 15 days. Repair for public infrastructures, livelihood assets and environmental . No benefits but provision of safety equipment.
- Shelter Cluster encourages partners to consider locations of cash for work so as not to conflict with volunteer activities.
- Beneficiary selection: CCT beneficiaries + non-Pantawid families who have sick, elderly but not necessary children. First roll-out for 50 people/each municipality. More to follow in second phase.
- LGU is making proposal for approval by DSWD.

## 4. DSWD UPDATES:

---

- Validation of totally and partially destroyed houses.
- List per Barangay and Municipality by Wednesday.
- This is list to be submitted to national office (for support with shelter).
- Dep. Public Works and Highways responsible for procuring and distributing materials. Technical group at National level to decide on materials.
- TWiG launched on Monday, from next Wednesday instead of regular meeting - Working Group on beneficiary selection – how to complement the list(s) of DSWD.
- 3 windows to complement the national government:
  - 1 window – cash transfers – will allow flexibility to procure other materials or pay for labour
  - buy equipment
  - facilitate construction training / technical support (incl. sanitation aspect)

- UN Habitat developing criteria for further discrimination of level of damage
- Red Cross began by targeting fully destroyed – interested to know what other org’s are doing. Only distributing in Capiz to fully destroyed houses
- MANDATORY GUIDELINES FOR MUNICIPALITIES:
  - 40 metres setback from coastal areas for reconstruction
  - 3 metres from river banks
- Relocation: depends on LGU plan. They are Authority for relocation.
- For DSWD, prior to receiving support the beneficiary list needs to be validated by LGU.
- Tarpaulins and other emergency
- Families to be provided with shelter assistance from DSWD must be living in safe zone.
- The LGU will buy the unsafe land. LGU to identify new land at their cost. Dep. Public Works and Highways 100,000 Peso core-shelter to construct new house in relocation zone.
- Handicap: most vulnerable in most hazardous spaces
- Shelter cluster to advocate for timelines for evacuation from LGU’s.
- Mayors instructed by 2 secretaries to submit
  - List 1 - for shelter assistance by December 8.
  - List 2 - Who is qualified for the core shelter.
- MEETING of Region 6 provincial representatives of DSWD tomorrow: Gerry Roxas Training Centre 13hrs. To discuss what assistance has been delivered in what areas so far and what are the gaps with which the humanitarian community can assist.
- Friday meeting not take place.
- Next shelter cluster meeting Monday 9<sup>th</sup>.

## 5. ASSESSMENTS

---

- Presentation next Monday on Aerial Damage Assessment (supported by DARAT, following path of typhoon across of Panay)
- From aerial observations, some communities affected more than others according to small changes in topography or location (particularly in the mountains and across the northern coast) so be careful not to generalise too much when extrapolating data or findings across larger regions.
