Strategic Objective 2

“Families with destroyed or damaged houses, including the displaced population, attain protective and sustainable shelter solutions.”



3-Phase Approach

- 1. Emergency Shelter**
- 2. Shelter self-recovery and temporary housing solutions**

Emergency Shelter

480,000 households reached with emergency shelter materials such as tents and tarps. (Target= 300,000)

Shelter self-recovery
