## KEY FACTS

### Shelter Activities

- 402,335** houses damaged in the Provinces of Leyte and Biliran (DROMIC damage data)
- 249,197** households reached with emergency shelter solutions (tarps or tents and NFIs)
- 57,914** households reached with support for self recovery
  - Of which: **54,132** with roofing materials
  - 777** with transitional or core shelter
  - 3,005** with cash sufficient to allow purchase of roofing (>10,000 PHP per HH)

### Current status in Leyte and Biliran

Enormous progress has been made to address the immediate shelter needs of the affected population. Despite these achievements the Shelter Cluster is very concerned by the imminent start of this year's Typhoon season and the deadly threat it poses to the population. Thousands of households still require support for self recovery of shelter. Areas still in need of assistance can be found across Leyte and Biliran with the most concentrated areas in Tacloban City, Ormoc City, North Western Leyte and inland. In addition, hundreds of families in evacuation centres and no build zones (NBZ) still require shelter options. ### Notes on the data

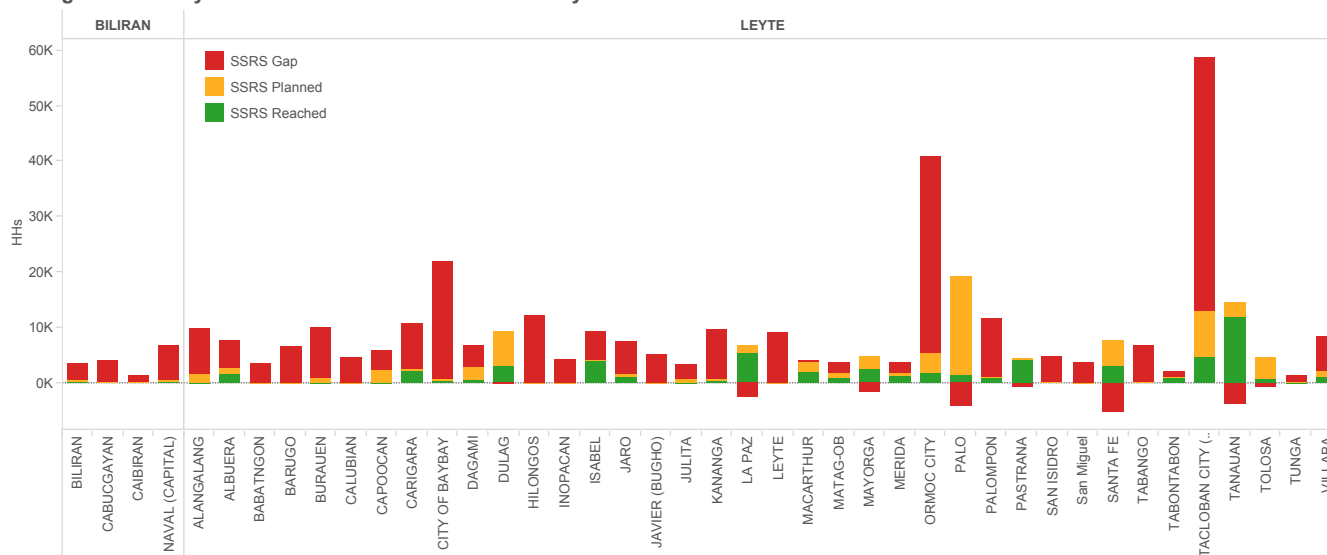
#### What is known

The data presented in this dashboard is only the data reported to the Shelter Cluster by agencies. The efforts of local government and many small local NGO's are not captured thus far. The Shelter Cluster encourages all agencies working in the shelter response to report their activities to reporting.phil@sheltercluster.org

#### Validity of data

The population is a 2013 projection based on the 2010 census. The number of houses damaged is based on the DSWD DROMIC data which was last updated 18 December 2013. The damage is a rapid estimate of damage which should be taken as an indication. Partners are advised to do a local assessment of damage.
