Summary Minutes

DSWD/LGU updates for Govt assistance

- DSWD Asec Camilo Gudmalin gave a briefing (please see attached PowerPoint)
- One of key points for shelter cluster is that the Govt intends to fill the gaps that won't be addressed by humanitarian agencies providing shelter. The implications for this is that the shelter cluster will have to map more precisely the inputs and funded plans of all humanitarian agencies so the Govt can know precisely where the gaps are.

Action: Shelter cluster needs to identify a mechanism to achieve this, identify resources to fund this. Decisions to be advised in due course

- A number of questions were raised from the floor and answers given.

Action: Shelter cluster to prepare document with outline of our understanding of Govt position in relation to issues raised and discussed, confirm with DSWD and issue an advisory note with/through HLP TWIG in Manila.

Update on overall needs with focus on gaps and overlaps

The data shared below has been extracted from the 4Ws information circulated earlier.

Key data limitations

- DSWD revised DROMIC data produced on 9th Dec. These new figures have not been inputted yet.
- DSWD figures for delivery of assistance are not yet included as only available to SCT today.
- Caseload figures may need to be further reviewed in light of REACH and MIRA assessments.
- Civil society and self-help inputs are not quantified and included here (we don't have means to do this)
- Some planned emergency shelter may not be delivered if funds are not forthcoming which would reduce coverage

Tacloban City	49,427	YES	City informally advise (survey nearly completed) that there are about 30,000 formally settled households affected, 10,000 informal affected and another 10,000 informal settled on no build zone. It was noted that in Tacloban many people have salvaged a lot of material so most people have been able to achieve some form of sheltering solution. The focus now will be on relocations.

- The data shows strong evidence that there is oversupply/capacity in some municipalities and undersupply in others, particularly those listed above. SCT field visit on 11th Dec affirmed that Tolosa, Tanauan and Julita (with USAID plastic given through DSWD ?) look well covered.

Action: Shelter cluster team to follow up bi-laterally with agencies in municipality with potential oversupply

Action: SCT to notify Govt. and OCHA of oversupply locations with expectation that some agencies may need to relocate.

Action: SCT to consider developing a capacity to do independent monitoring of all shelter inputs to help guide coordination.

Municipal level coordination

- Municipal focal point TOR has been circulated with list of agencies present by municipality

Action: humanitarian agencies to propose where they could act as municipal focal points (thanks to CRS for already doing so)

Action: SCT will provide proposed list of focal points by next week

TWIGs update

Emergency Shelter TWIG:

- Aware that Tacloban city is looking to set up small interim tented camps.
- In general most actors are winding up their emergency interventions and moving to recovery items.

Action; Agencies agreed they would not want to hand tents over to city until adequate camp layout, drainage, WASH, access to livelihoods, understanding of camp exit strategy and camp management was in place.

Action; Shelter Cluster issuing an advisory.

Recovery Shelter TWIG

- IOM and DSWD has started distributions of CGI sheet. Some agencies may look to assist DSWD with incorporating software and fixings and tools into distributions.
- May be some joint training between agencies. Especially for carpenters.
- Transitional and permanent shelter breakout TWIG

Action; All agencies will share designs and bill of quantities and modalities of working.
