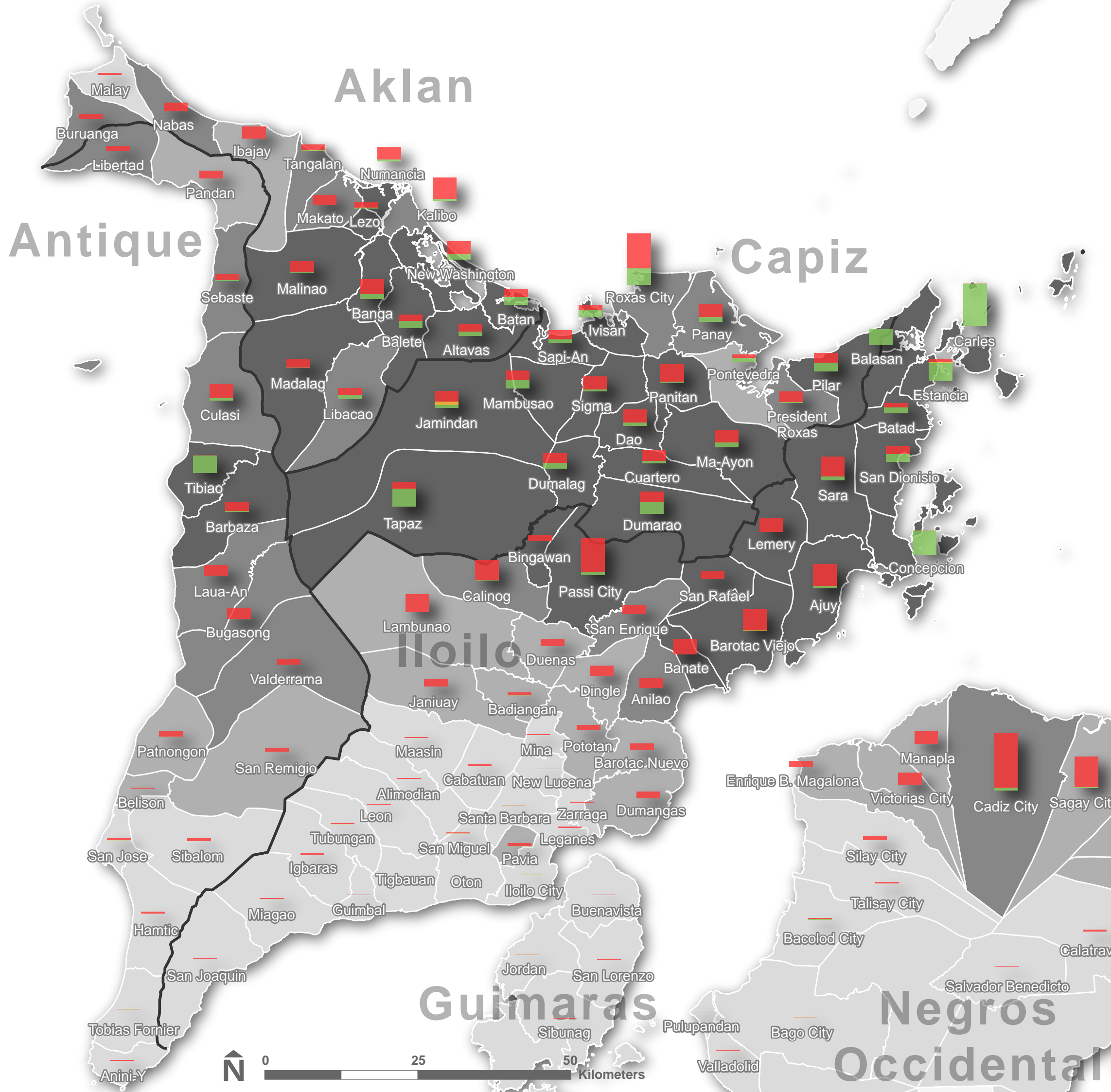
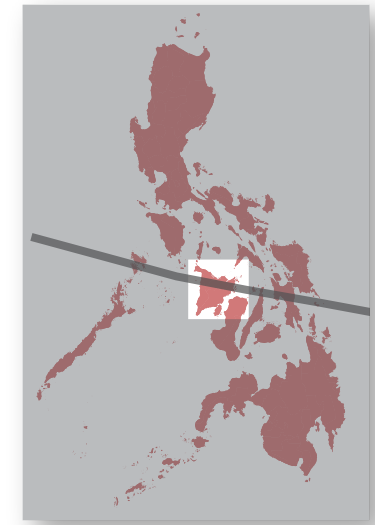


# Emergency Shelter in Region VI (Roxas)

This **Emergency Shelter Coverage Map** depicts the gap between total damaged households per municipalities and households receiving / planned to be receiving emergency shelter from shelter cluster partners. Emergency shelter solutions: tarpaulins and fixings (minimum 1 per household), plastic sheeting and fixings, or tents.

**Damage Density** is a proxy indicator for the proportion of damaged households based on a 2013 projected population, estimated average household size (4.7) and estimated household damaged (DSWD).
