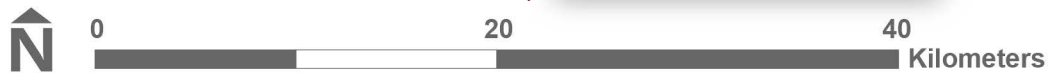

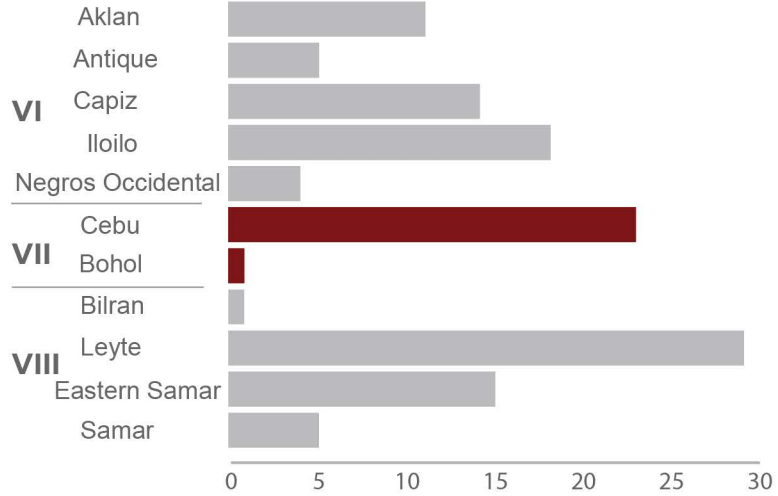

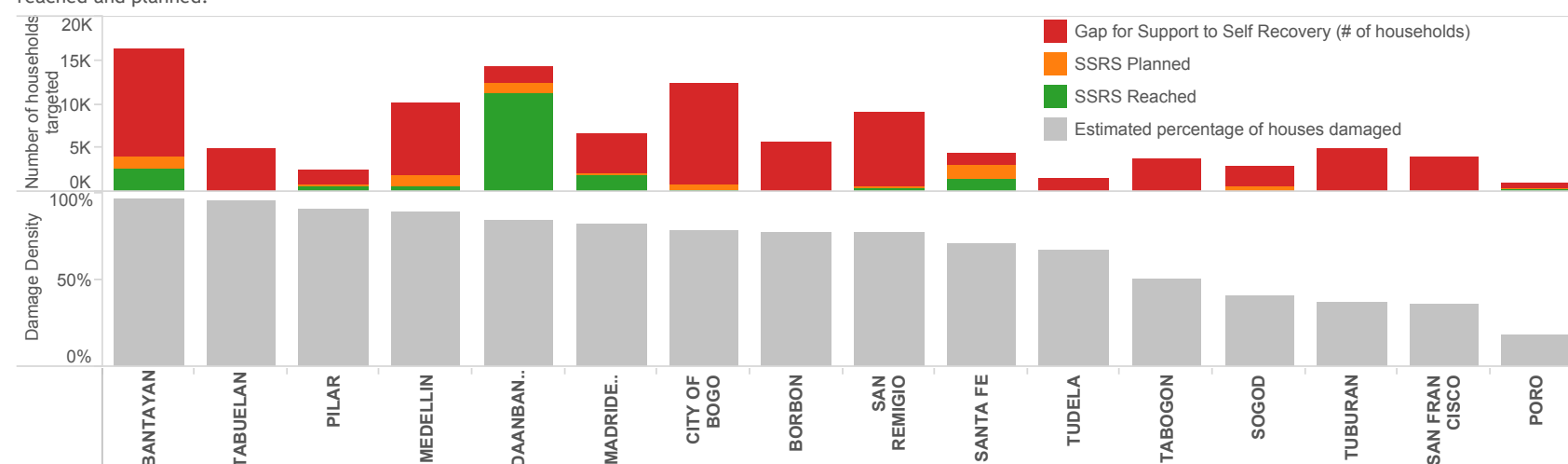

## Key facts

- 103,318** households are affected in the 16 most hit municipalities in the north of Cebu
- 65%** of affected households are reached with emergency shelter support
- 15%** of affected households received support to self recovery of shelter
- 25** agencies currently active in shelter

## Current status in Cebu

Acute shelter needs have largely been addressed as a result of significant distribution of emergency shelter material in the past months. However shelter conditions remain precarious for hundreds of families. In several instances, emergency shelters are barely adequate to withstand current weather conditions and families require more sustainable solutions. A significant capacity gap is affecting shelter self-recovery and reconstruction. The gap is more acute on the Cebu mainland, where few humanitarian organisations are available in some municipalities. Projects are generally small-scale in size and funding is limited in time.

## Notes on the data

### What is known

The data presented in this dashboard is only the data reported to the Shelter Cluster by agencies. In general almost all agencies are reporting to the Shelter Cluster. The efforts of local government and many small local NGO's are not captured thus far. The Shelter Cluster motivates all agencies working in the shelter response to report their activities to reporting.phil@sheltercluster.org

### Needs data

Due to a lack of consolidated household needs data, the needs are currently presented as damage density. The damage density is the number of houses damaged (both partial and total) divided by the total number of houses.

### Validity of data

The number of houses damaged is based on the DROMIC data which was last updated 18 december 2013. The number of houses is calculated by using a projection of the population in 2013, divided by the average number of persons per household (4.7). The damage density is just an indication and could be well off if the population or damage data provided by the government is incorrect. Partners are advised to do a local assessment.
