STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES

- SO1: Contribute to the protection of newly displaced people and those affected by natural hazards from life-threatening elements
- SO2A: Improve the living conditions of people in need at stabilized IDP settlements
- SO2B: Facilitate access to durable solutions for displaced people through integration and relocation
- SO3: To improve the service provision by Shelter / NFI Cluster partners through enhanced coordination, improved needs assessments and the use of common tools and designs

NEED ANALYSIS

Somalia continues to face a severe humanitarian crisis with displacement across the country from natural disaster and conflict in 2014. Humanitarian actors operate within insecure environment at great personal risk, and with restricted movement and access.

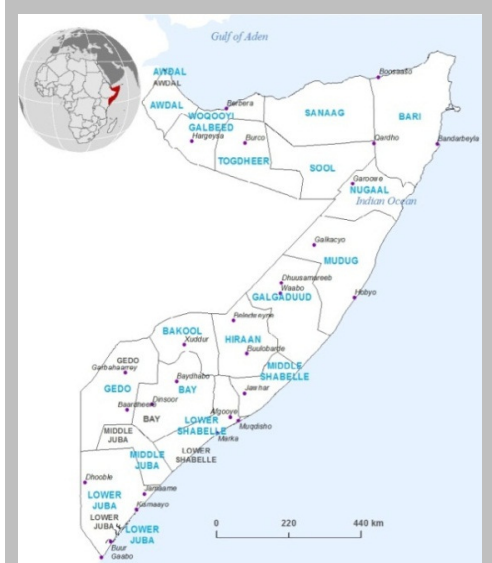
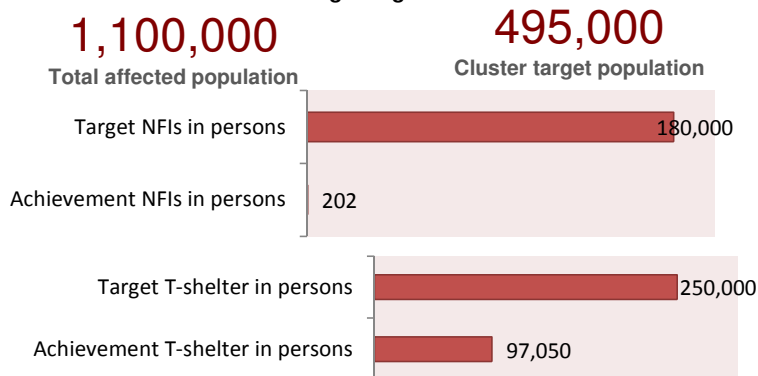
IDPs in Mogadishu and Kismaayo suffer from secondary displacement through evictions. In South Central Somalia, new displacements are common due to inter-clan conflict, floods, military offensive and disruption of market activities. Drop out pastoralists remains problematic in the Gedo and Juba regions.

HIGHLIGHTS

- ❑ Infrastructure mapping exercises started in Hargeysa, Burao, Jowhar, Marka and Baidoa.
- ❑ During the month of November and December, 4000 NFIs were distributed in Jowhar and Marka (inter-clan conflict and floods). Many other individual households were targeted by UNHCR in Hargeysa.
- ❑ There are urgent needs of NFIs in Baidoa due to increased displacement. Cluster is in contact with Logistics cluster for air-lifting.
- ❑ T-shelters are completed in Baidoa and on-going in Kismaayo, Bossaso, Qardho, Hargeysa and other locations.

KEY FIGURES

The Shelter cluster has been able to provide a good level of emergency assistance in 2014 due to the use of in-country stocks. In total, 9,372 persons were provided with Emergency Shelter, 194,994 persons received NFIs, 97,050 persons with Transitional shelter and 3,606 persons with permanent shelter. Around 73,000 of T-shelters provided were simple shelter kits that were distributed in the beginning of 2014.
