Expected figures and locations in the table are indicative for planning purposes</li> <li>○ Partners in Duhok are collaborating well.</li> </ul>
<p><b>3. <u>A. Ongoing Emergency Response planning.</u></b></p>	<p>The government authorities in Q4 wants to hold IDPs in Shirgat + Qayyara despite being a military operations theatre. Camps are limited there. More out of camp assistance is required (reference "settlement typologies'). Advocacy is needed with governorate partners regarding out of camp assistance, as camps</p>

are expensive, take a long time to set up, appropriate land availability is a hurdle, \$5,000 per plot is the standard cost in camps it can be brought down to \$2,000 in emergency situations (that is not counting WASH). Partners need to focus on out of camp solutions as they will consist 85-90% of the IDP caseload. Authorities in Suly are requesting partners to consider Chamchamal for building a camp (although they are not part of the Quadrant) assuming there will be an overflow of IDPs from Kirkuk or Erbil. The land that was proposed was not suitable though.

Another proposed camp site "Hassan Sham" will either fall under Q1 or Q2

The HC is meeting Donors and MOMD to discuss the overhead of Mosul operations. The government is asking for 30,000 plots in Q4 (calculates \$70,000,000) not including WASH!

Version VIII of the "Q" mapping of partners is available.

The HPF (Humanitarian Pool Fund) has \$2 mill. The ICCG meeting will decide how this will be prioritized across clusters.

The "Logistics" cluster assists with warehouse support. Partners should visit the cluster's link to check the mapping of locations.

MODM is building a camp in Duhok with a capacity of 1500 plots. CCCM will share an updated table for mapping the camps and their status.

Movement across checkpoint: access through checkpoints in Duhok by IDPs and partners is an issue. Partners are encouraged to share concerns.

	<p>Winterization: Duhok: inputs provided (who is doing what where) for emergency Shelter/NFI kit.</p> <p>Kerosene distribution /two modalities in-kind (camp) &amp; cash (out of camp). No funding is available for either case. Last year 66 million liters of kerosene was distributed last year out of which 46% was given by the government, the rest through partners. Suly governorate has no funding for this item. Cash and vouchers can be explored in support of winterization.</p>
	<p>For updates during the Mosul preparations and throughout the crisis, a google sheet has been developed for partners to provide and update inputs across clusters. OCHA needs a daily update from the cluster, therefore partners need to report their plans and interventions regularly. Comments are welcomed from partners on the contents of the google sheet.</p>
	<p>Some technical documents (settlement typology; ESK, NFI kit) that the cluster is working to finalize will be sent to partners for comments. IDPs will need incremental support upon receiving the ESK</p>
	<p>Agencies' updates:</p> <p>Suly. governorate has built "Sirdash" camp for Syrian refugees.</p> <p>Duhok: 100-150 Iraqi HH have returned from Syria to Duhok. 100-170 Yazidi HH. returning to Sinjar from Syria</p> <p>Authorities have identified 6 reception centers. 2 in Q2 and 4 in Q1a. Q1a: Nargizli 1 &amp; 2 close to Zelikhan.</p> <p>Garmawa camp: 1000 shelters to expand in preparation for Mosul emergency. Assessment of 500 is completed. It will be a mix of the old and new caseload.</p> <p>45 HH have arrived from Mosul to Khazir.</p>

	<p>“The Islamic Kurdistan League” pledged to build 2000 plots or reception centers. It’s not clear whether WASH is included.</p> <p>70 Rub-halls will be provided in Duhok Q1 + Q2</p> <p>20 transit shelters will be set up in Duhok</p> <p>We need to know which partners will participate in building reception centers</p> <p>IOM brought up the issue of having to explore solar energy in emergency situations (he has undertaken some research on the topic. The technical coordinator from NRC stated that renewable energy will be considered. Solar lamps are already part of the NFI kit.</p> <p>There is a possibility that not many civilians will leave their locations (from Mosul) when the operations starts, this is based on the advice that has been given by the government &amp; ISF to stay put (an assumption by one of the partners).</p> <p>Inter cluster assessment of damage will take place, in which case the ESK will come useful for undertaking repairs.</p> <p>IOM is willing to help in translating technical documents. (Maha shared 2: ESK &amp; NFI kits)</p>
