Winter Response	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- all camps in C&amp;S are covered by UNHCR and IOM</li> <li>- presentation of the SC winter tool</li> <li>- IOM update: 1,000 winter kits (500 for IDP and 500 returnees) in Baghdad, 1,000 winter kits for Diyala (500 IDP Muhtadiya, 500 returnees Khanaqeen and Khalis), plans for Anbar including Qaim to be shared</li> <li>- UNHCR will cover Sector 1,2,3 in BezBez informal settlement</li> <li>- CRS requested more information on UNCHR's plans for the BezBez informal sites, UNCHR winter plan currently with senior management for final clearance, UNCHR will inform CRS on Sunday, 21,10,2018 on the concrete plans for this specific site</li> <li>- CRS asked all partners to share with them assessed/identified needs for winter support in Anbar (Falluja, Ramadi) and Baghdad which cannot be covered by other partners</li> </ul>	<p>UNHCR to inform CRS on BezBez plans on 21.10. SC Co Chair to follow up</p> <p>Partners to share winter plans on subdistrict/location level with SC Co Chair (by Thursday, 18.10.2018 for info to be included in the to be published tool)</p>

HNO HRP	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- SC partners will be informed on specific objectives, targets, indicators and activities for the HRP 2019 once available (indicatively next week)</li> <li>- The system to upload proposals will open end of Oct.</li> <li>- Targeting of the most vulnerable people (socio economic vulnerability) will be even more in the centre of SC interventions in 2019 than this year</li> </ul>

Camp Closure and Evictions (presented by CCCM C&amp;S Coord)</p>	<p>Please refer for more in-depth information to the CCCM Cluster C&amp;S meeting presentation of 17.10.2019</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Tikrit: security actors visited the large complexes 2 weeks ago, since then no further pushed for evictions</li> <li>- Shahama/Karama Camp: plan to close the sections of Shahama camp, 120 HH are currently residing there, 70 of them are planned to move to different camps in their areas of origin</li> <li>- Anbar: after sudden closure of Al Khaldiya Camp there are mixed signals from the authorities, rumour that all camps in Anbar despite AAF shall close by the end of 2018 persist, but there is no written statement on this matter – CCCM expects no closure before the end of winter and continues to advocate with service actors to not start scaling down humanitarian assistance in those camps</li> <li>- Baghdad: Al Wahdah Camp (35HH) potentially closes 25.10.2018 and HH either move to their areas of origin or Al Ahel camp, larger sections of Shams camp to be evicted around the same time, Al Ahel and Al Amel Camp to remain open (ongoing conversation between CCCM, IOM and UNHCR on potential upgrades of the Shelter)</li> </ul>	<p>CCCM, UNHCR, IOM to update the Shelter Cluster on the shelter situation/need sin Al Ahel and Al Amel Camp</p>
<p>5. Other operational topics</p>	<p>Area based coordination in Qaim</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Partners voiced their wish for area based coordination support – a Qaim specific meeting shall be organized when the new Subnational Cluster Coordinator for C&amp;S is in place</li> <li>- SC Co Chair informed the partners on the follow up of her mission to Qaim and the last SC meeting in Baghdad especially around the challenges of beneficiary targeting (HH assessments need to be conducted, to only receive lists from local authorities is not accepted and will breach the Do No Harm principle/our mandate), communications with communities, challenges with local authorities, limited on the ground cooperation and coordination with shelter actors in the same areas</li> <li>- Partners agreed on strengthen their communication with each other especially in light with more planned repair activities in the next months</li> <li>- Partners involved in shelter repairs in West Anbar: UNHCR (with CAOFISR), IOM, ZOA, PIN, NRC</li> <li>- ZOA underlined the importance of being engaged with the local authorities in order to remain a safe and secure operational environment on the ground and to strengthen advocacy</li> <li>- REMINDER: partners shall report their assessments, plans and intervention in the Shelter Cluster UNHABITAT webportal and the Coordinator for Centre and South</li> </ul>	<p>C&amp;S Coordinator to organize a meeting specifically for Qaim actors</p> <p>PUI to share with SC Co Chair their repair plans in West Anbar in order to strengthen coordination, PUI to also report their activities on the SC UNHABITAT webportal</p> <p>UNHCR to share with SC CO Chair the repair plans which were shared with UNHABITAT to be uploaded on the webportal</p>
